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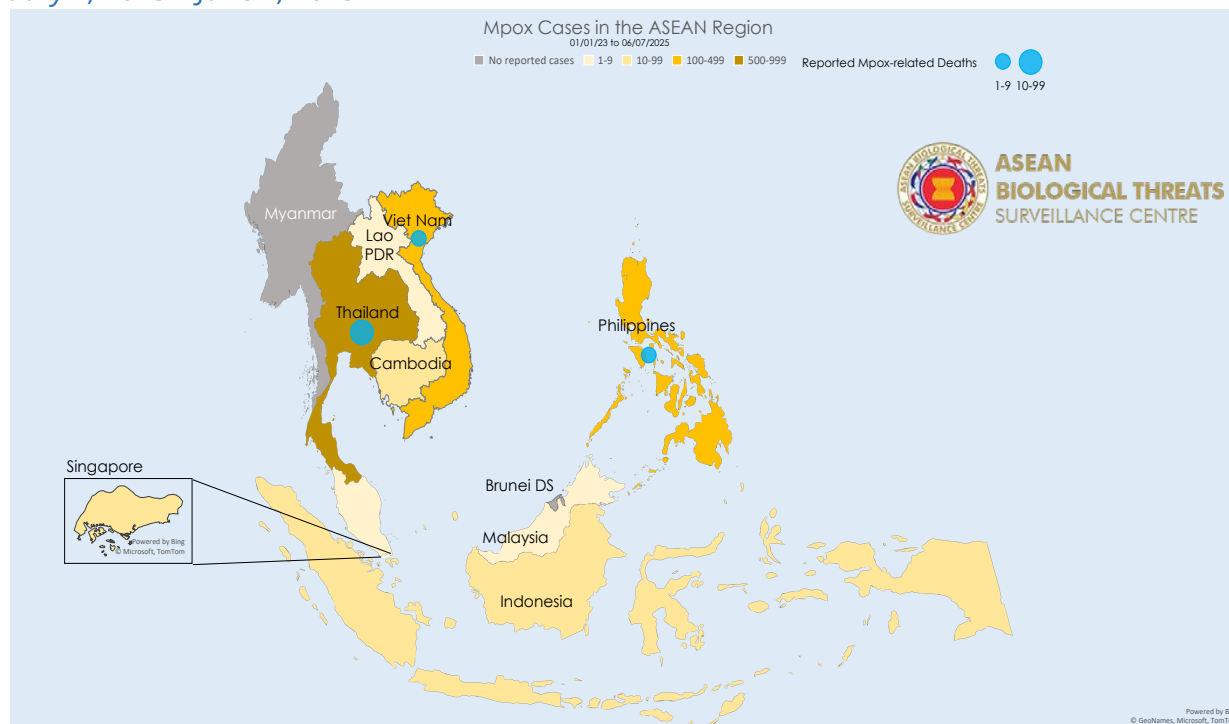

Mpox Cases Reported in the ASEAN Region

January 1, 2023 – June 7, 2025



Key Findings

- From 1 January 2023 to 7 June 2025, **55,446** confirmed cases worldwide since 2023, including **280** deaths. Globally, the CFR was **0.50 %**.
- 1,394 confirmed cases** including **26 deaths** in the **ASEAN** region, with a CFR of **1.87%**.
- 54,052 confirmed cases** of mpox have been reported in **other regions** (other than the **ASEAN** region):

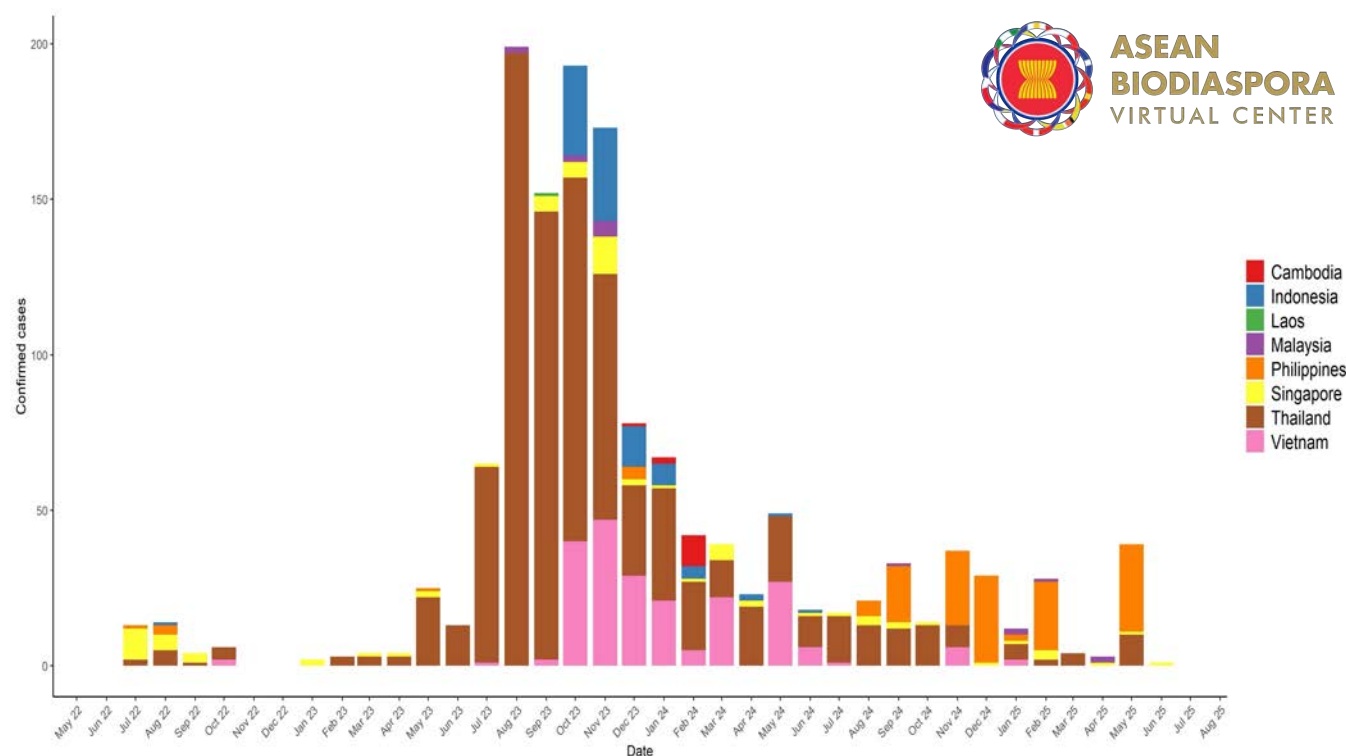

Trend of Mpox Confirmed Cases in the ASEAN Region

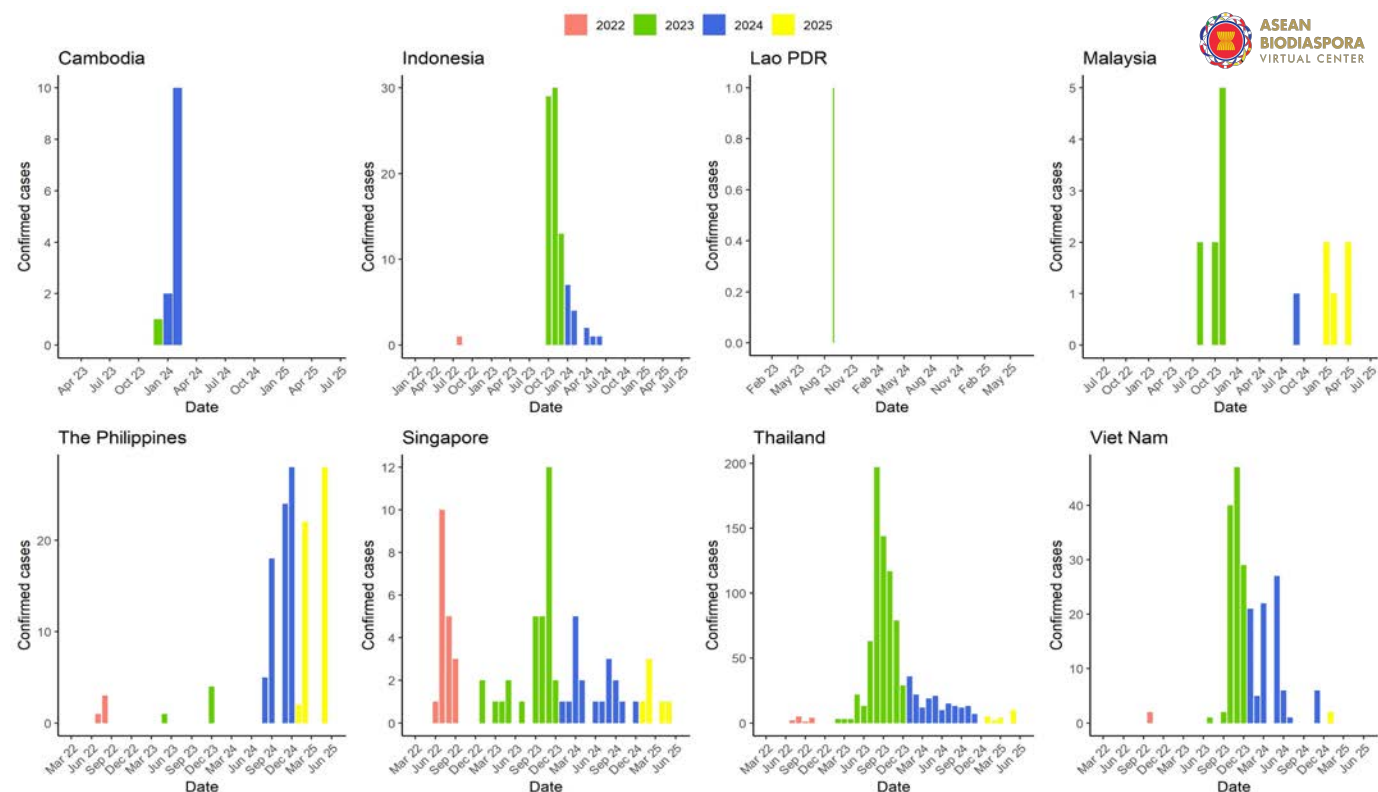
January 1, 2022 to June 7, 2025

January 1, 2022 to June 7, 2025

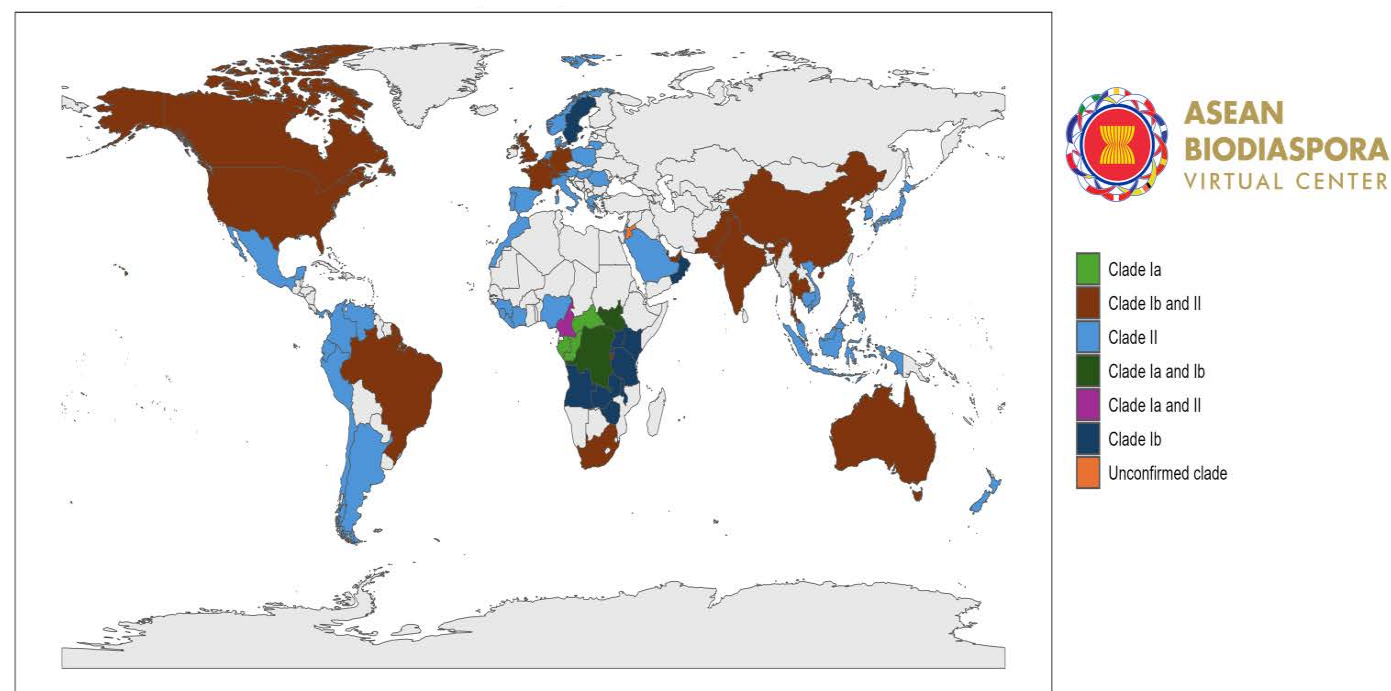

Distribution of Mpox Variants in The Global

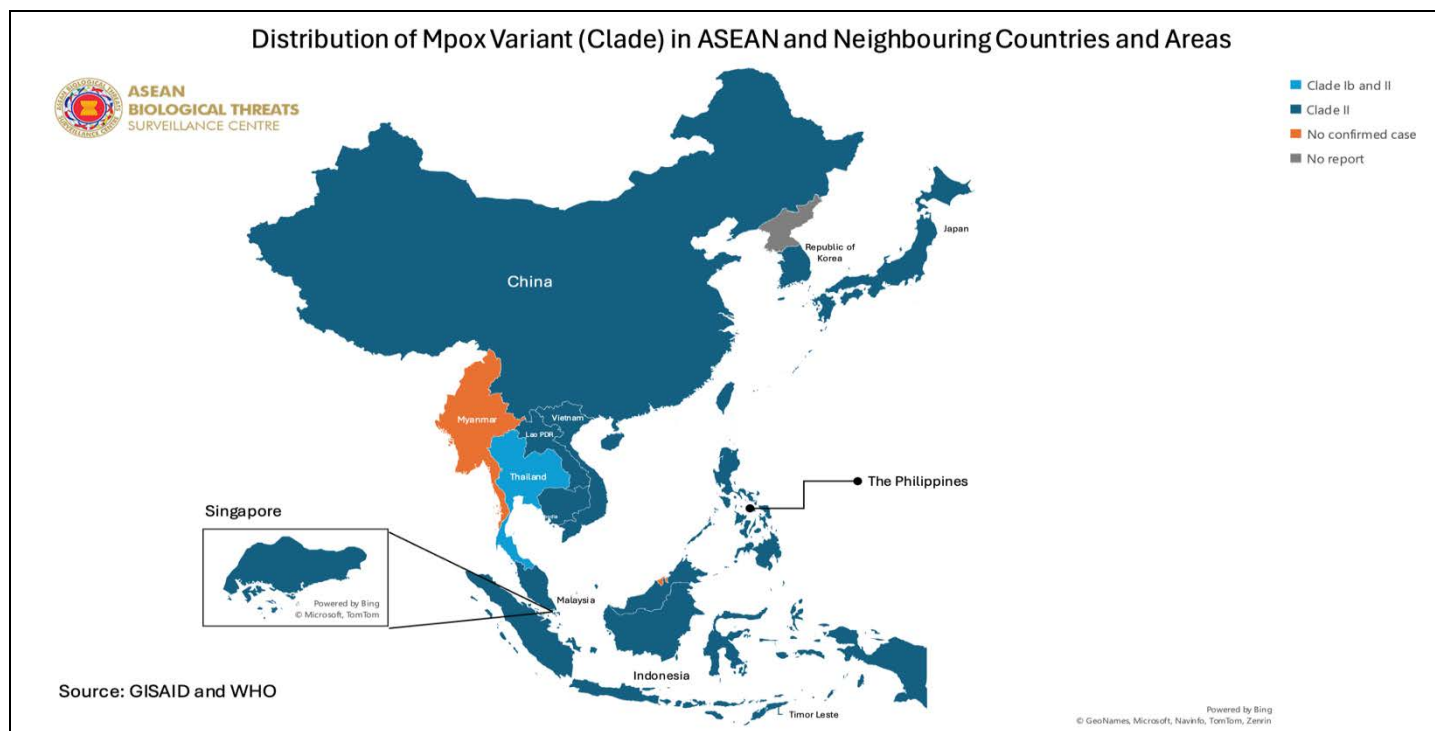

Distribution of Mpox Variants in the ASEAN and Neighbouring Countries and Areas As of June 7, 2025



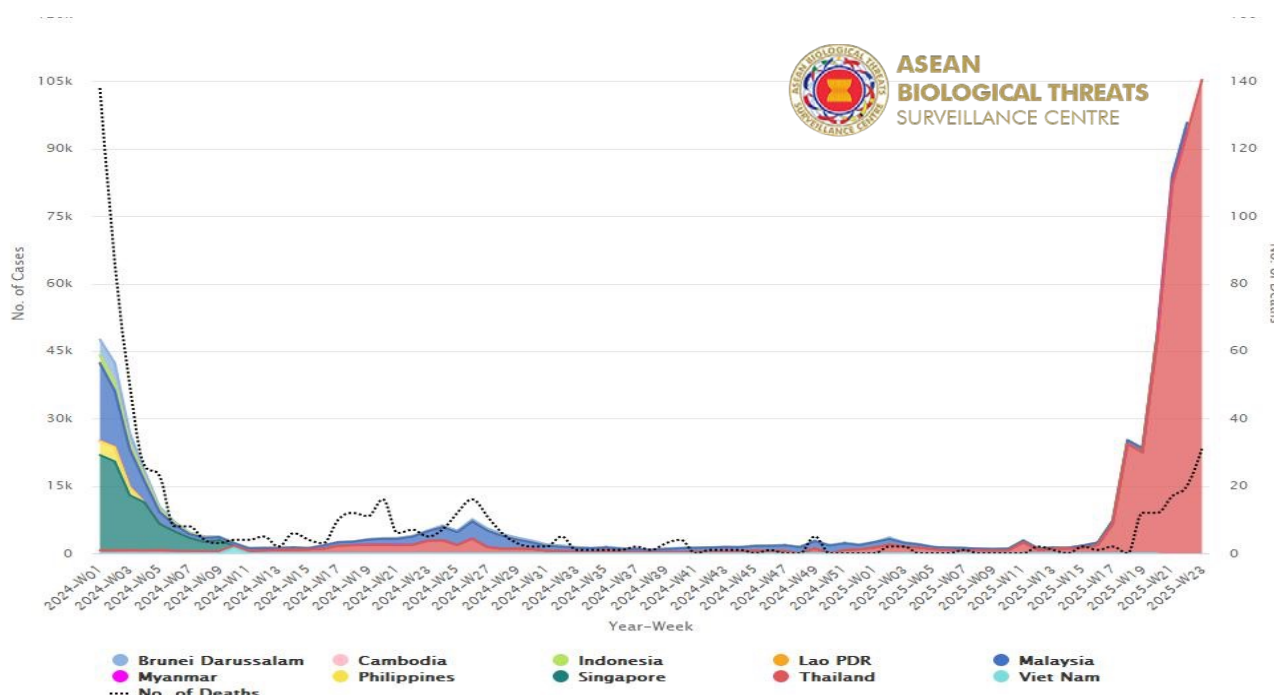
COVID-19

Key Findings

- As of 7 June 2025 (5PM, GMT+7), there were **777,946,689** confirmed cases **worldwide**, including **7,095,318 deaths**. Globally, the Case Fatality Rate (CFR) was **0.91%**.
- 37,366,773 total confirmed cases** of COVID-19 have been reported in the **ASEAN Region**.
- The CFR in the **ASEAN Region** was **0.99%**.
- NB.1.8.1** variant show a dominance number in Thailand, Singapore, and Vietnam. Meanwhile, Cambodia shows dominance in **Omicron B.1.1.529+BA.*** variant.

ASEAN Weekly COVID-19 Cases and Deaths

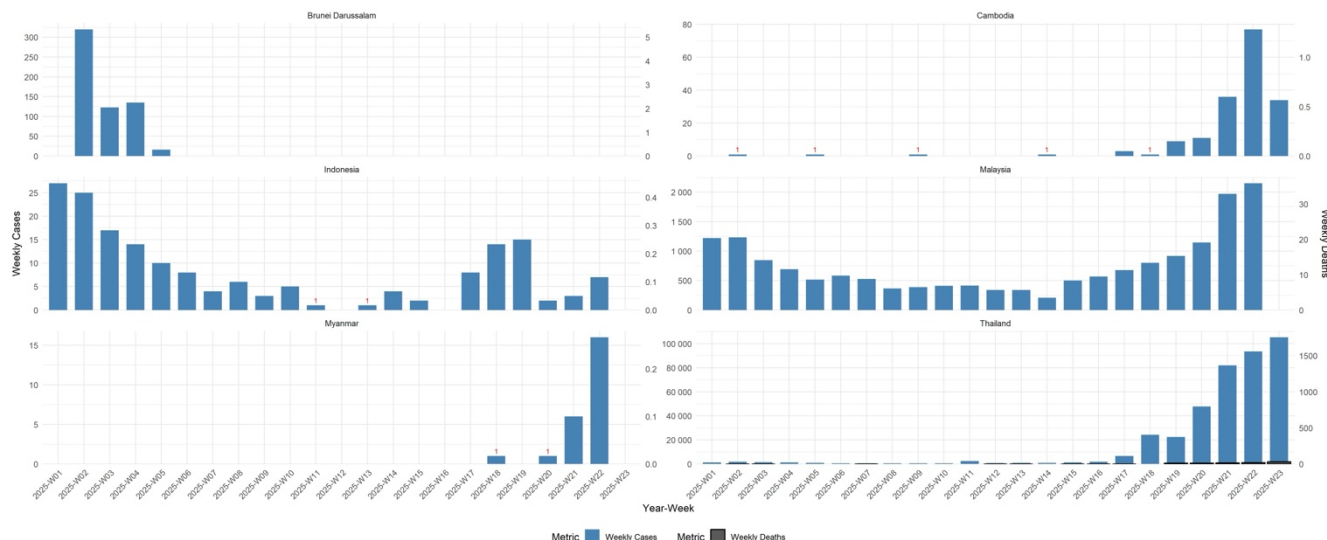

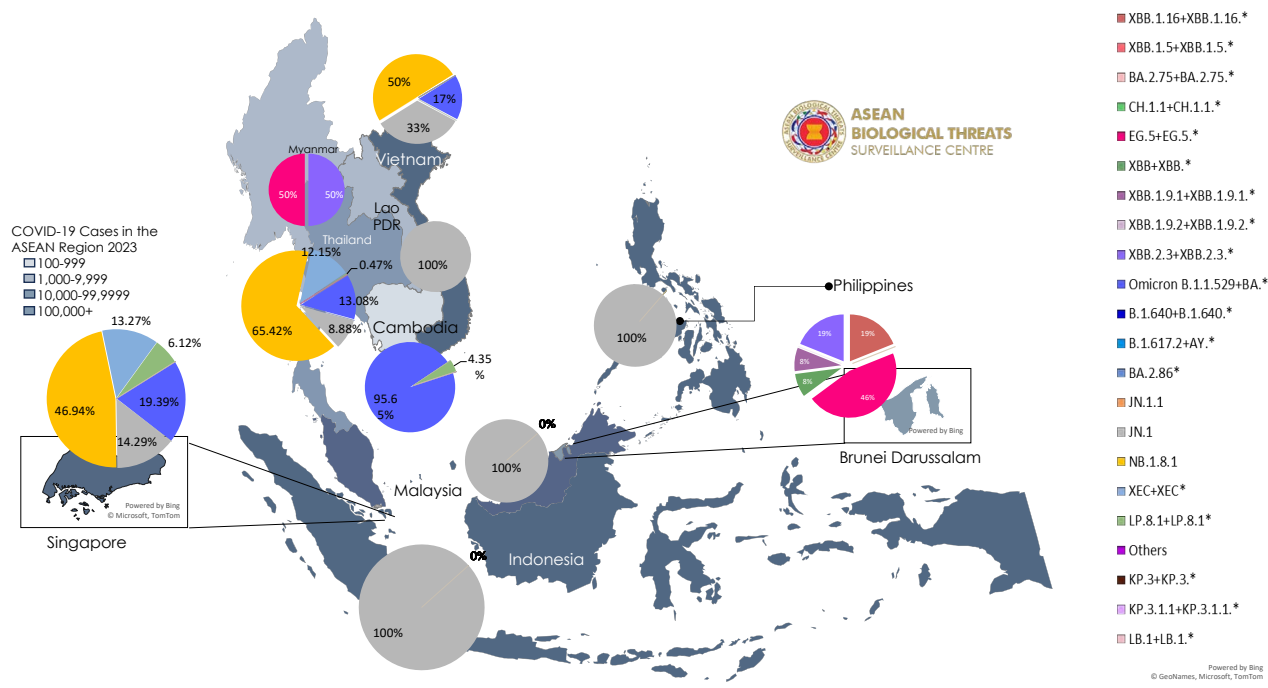
ASEAN Weekly COVID-19 Cases and Deaths among ASEAN Member States

From January 1, 2024 to June 7, 2025



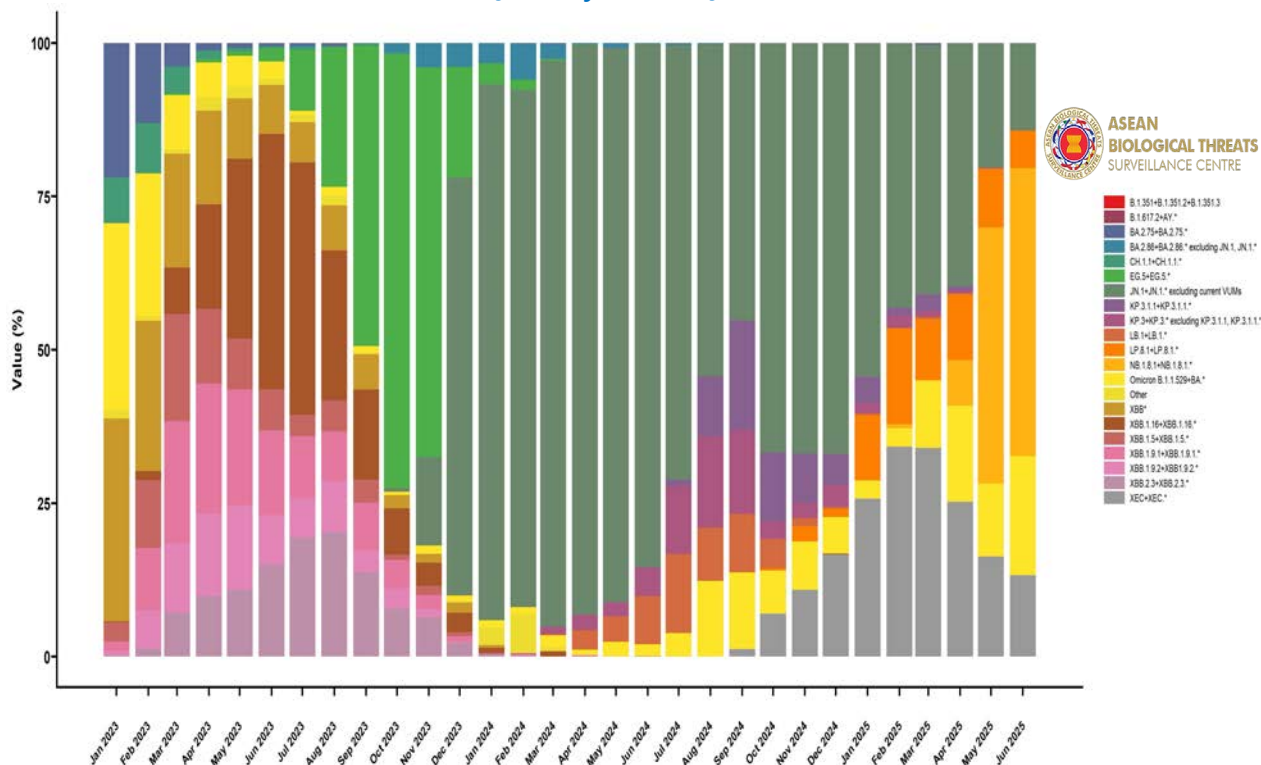

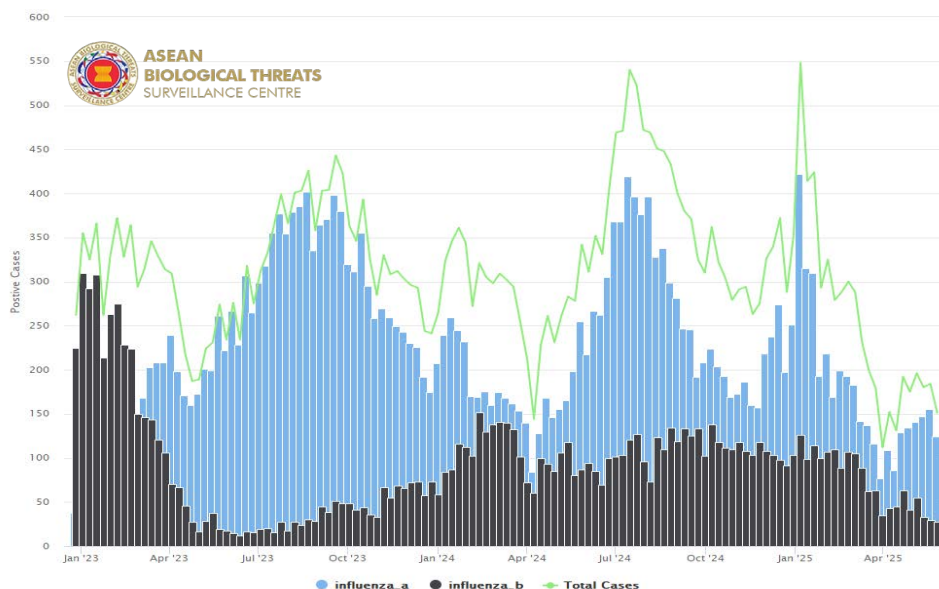
INFLUENZA

Trends of Influenza Confirmed Cases in the ASEAN region

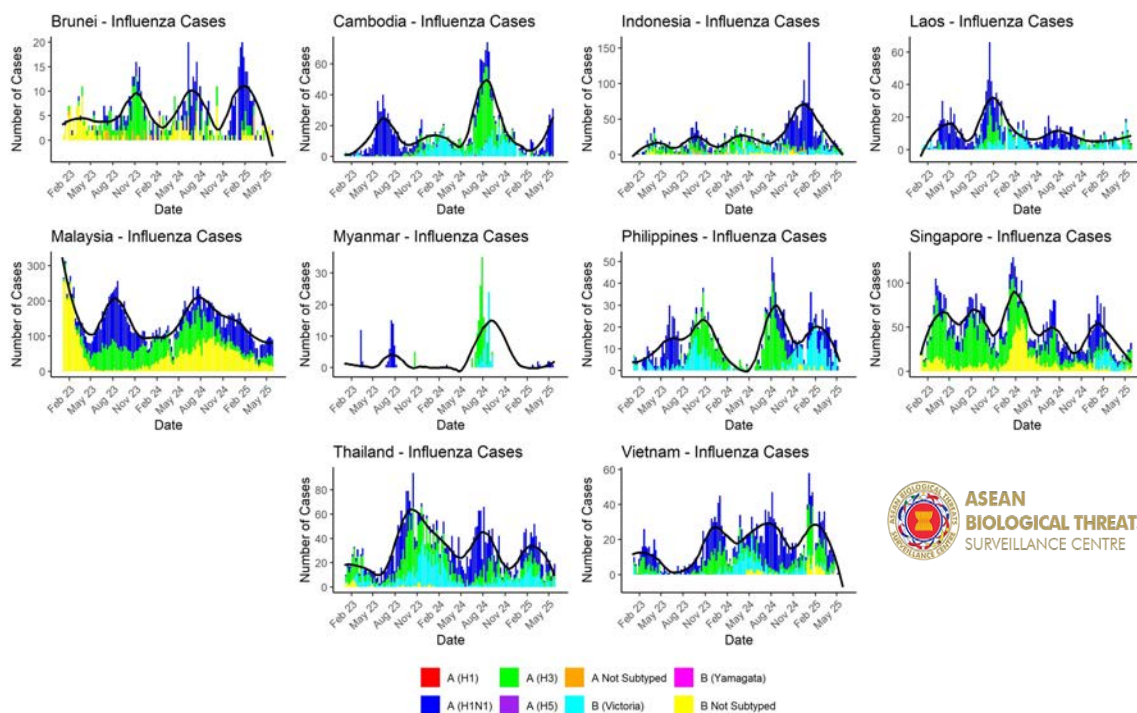

Trend of Influenza Cases among ASEAN Member States

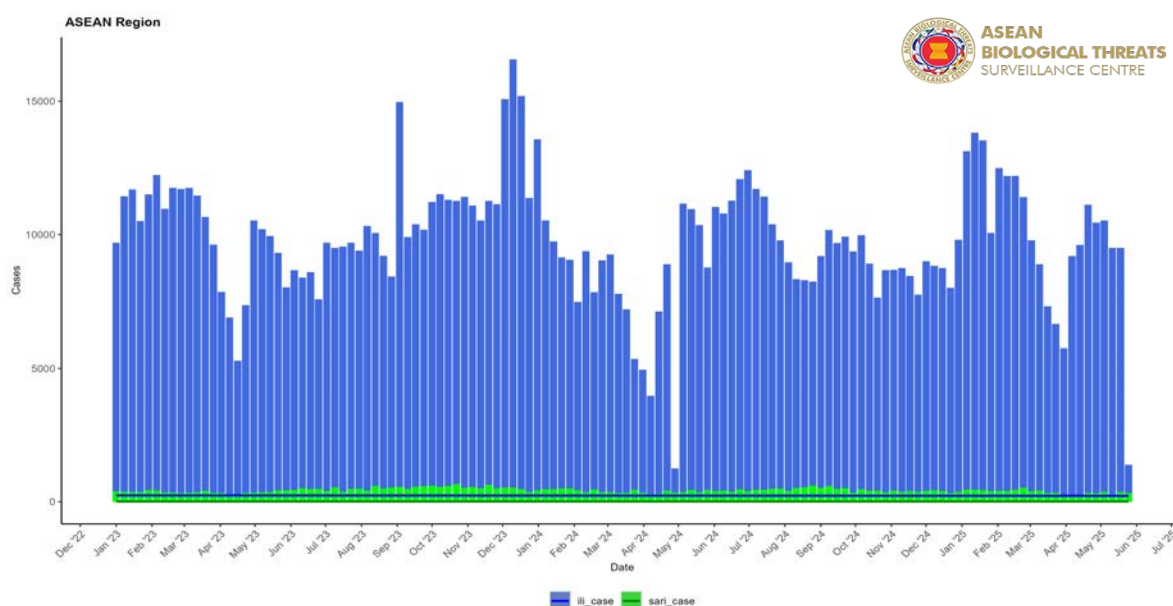

Trend of Influenza-like Illness (ILI) and Severe Acute Respiratory Illness (SARI) in the ASEAN Region

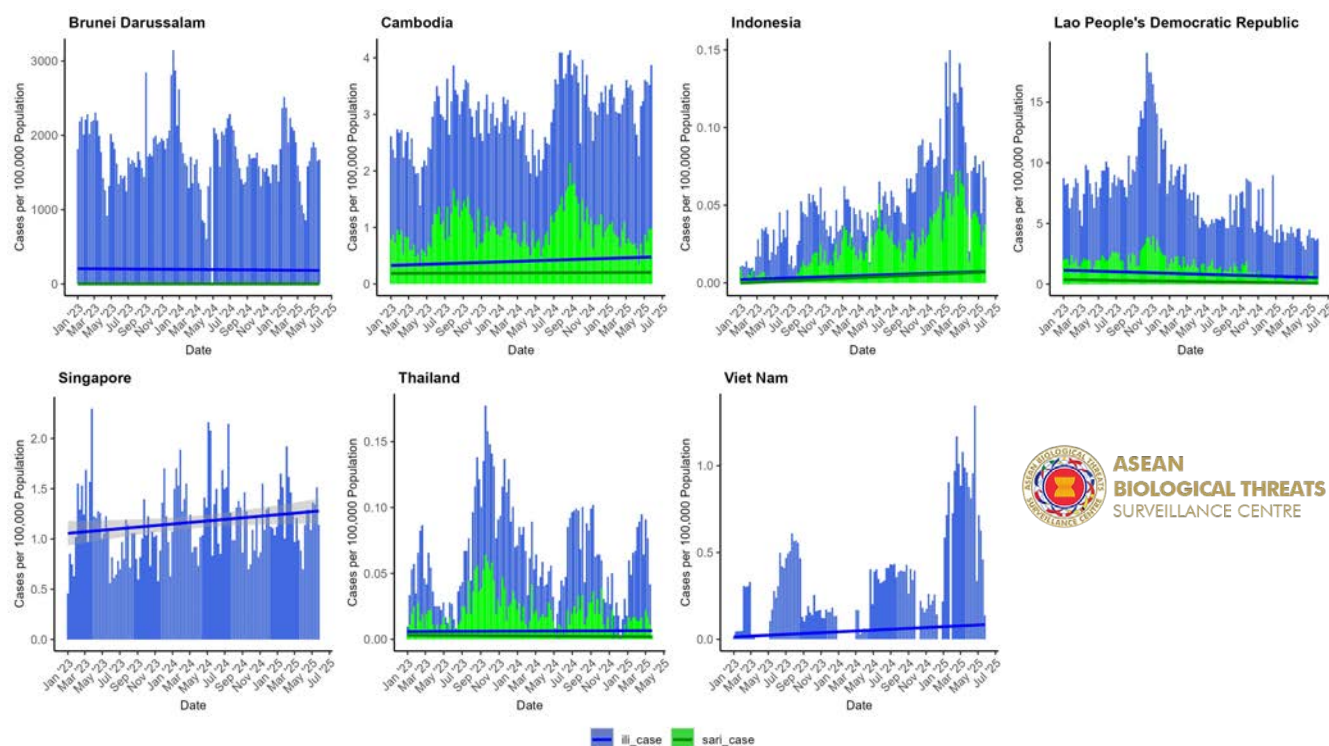

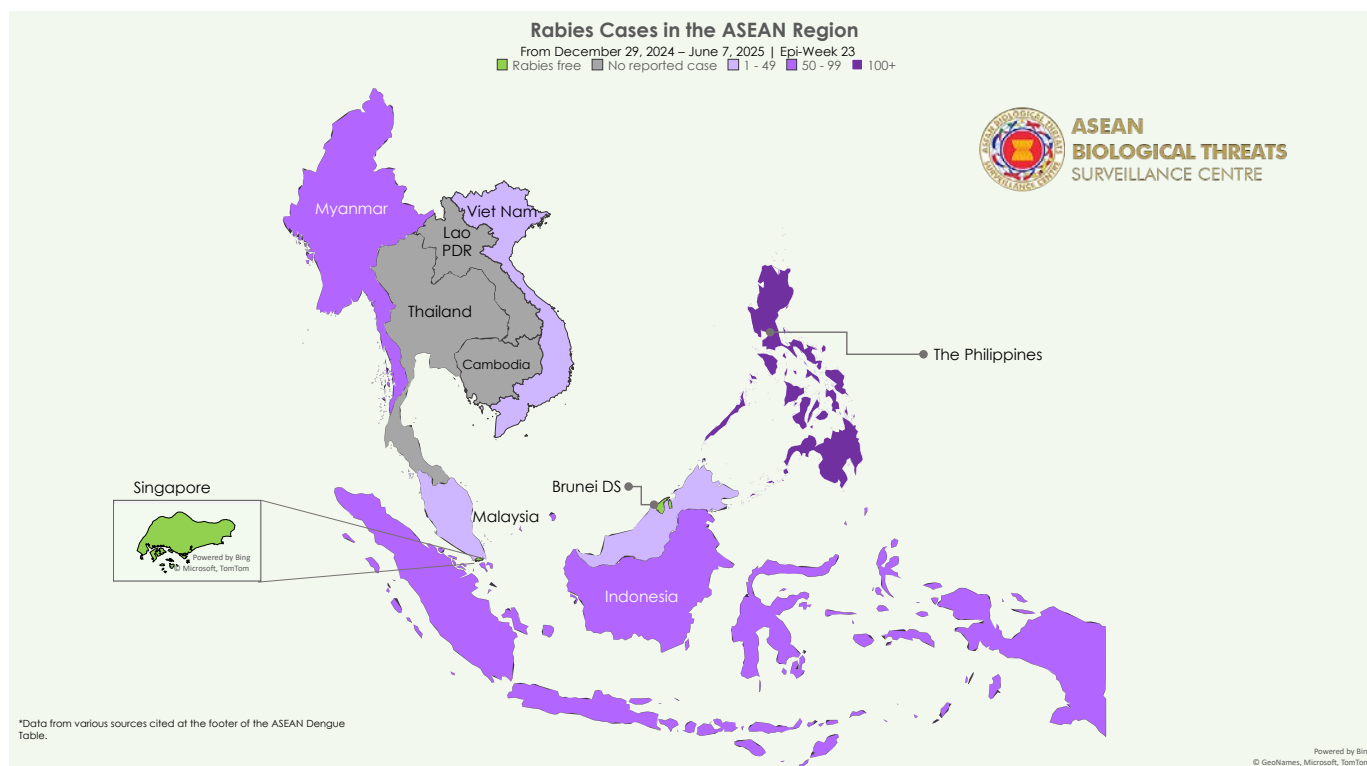
RABIES

Rabies Cases in the ASEAN Region

From December 29, 2024 to May 31, 2025 (Epi-Week 23, 2025)

Key Findings

- The **ASEAN** region reported **16** new rabies cases in Epiweek 23, 2025.
- Up to June 7, 2025, the region reported **272** total cases with **100%** CFR.

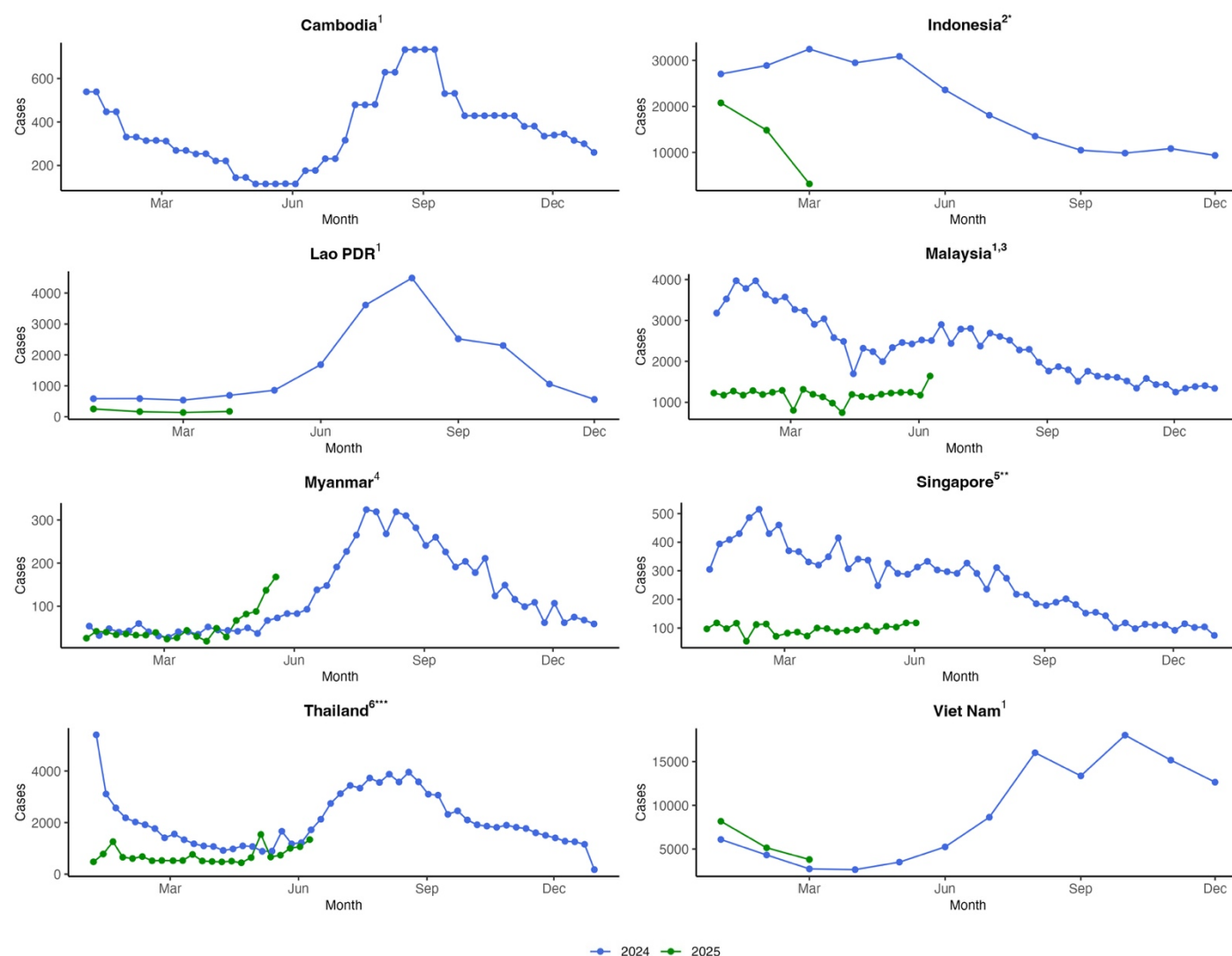
Dengue Cases in the ASEAN Region

From December 29, 2024 to June 7, 2025 (Epi-Week 23, 2025)

Key Findings

- The **ASEAN** region reported **3,102** new dengue cases in Epiweek 23, 2025.
- Up to June 7, 2025, the region reported **103,773** total cases and **225** total deaths with **0.22% CFR**.
- Most dengue trends in 2025 among AMS showing lower number of cases compared to previous year at the same period. While Myanmar and Viet Nam showing higher trend of cases compared to previous year.

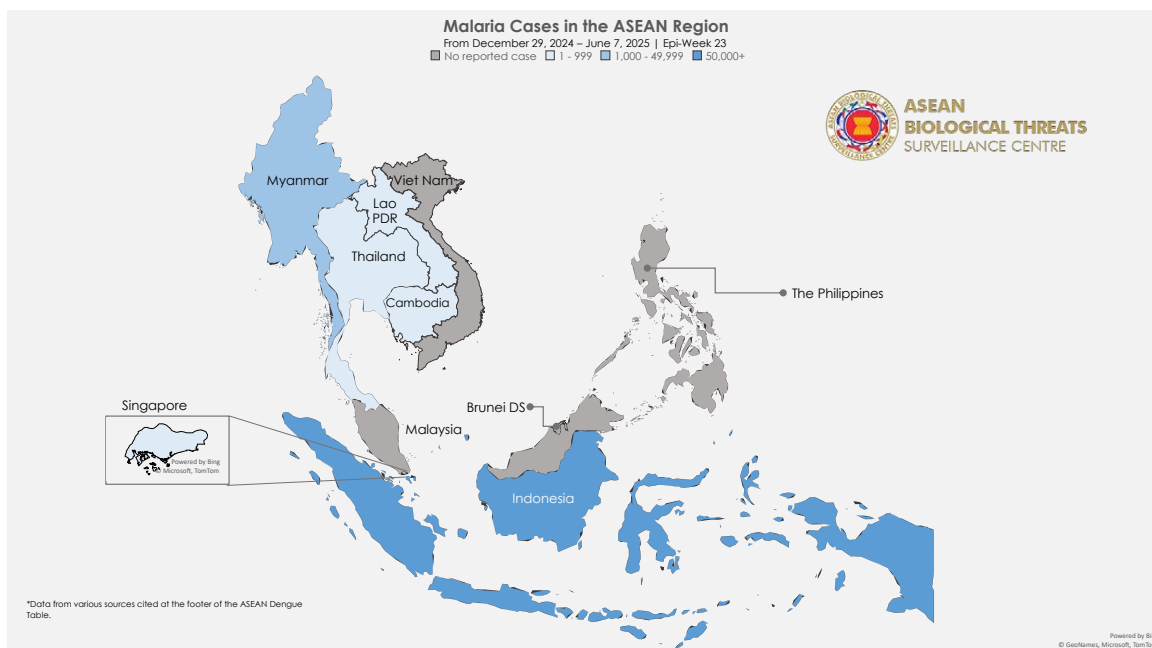
MALARIA

- The **ASEAN** region reported **6,373** new malaria cases in Epiweek 23, 2025.
- Up to June 7, 2025, the region reported **288,307** total cases and **56** deaths with **0.02%** CFR.



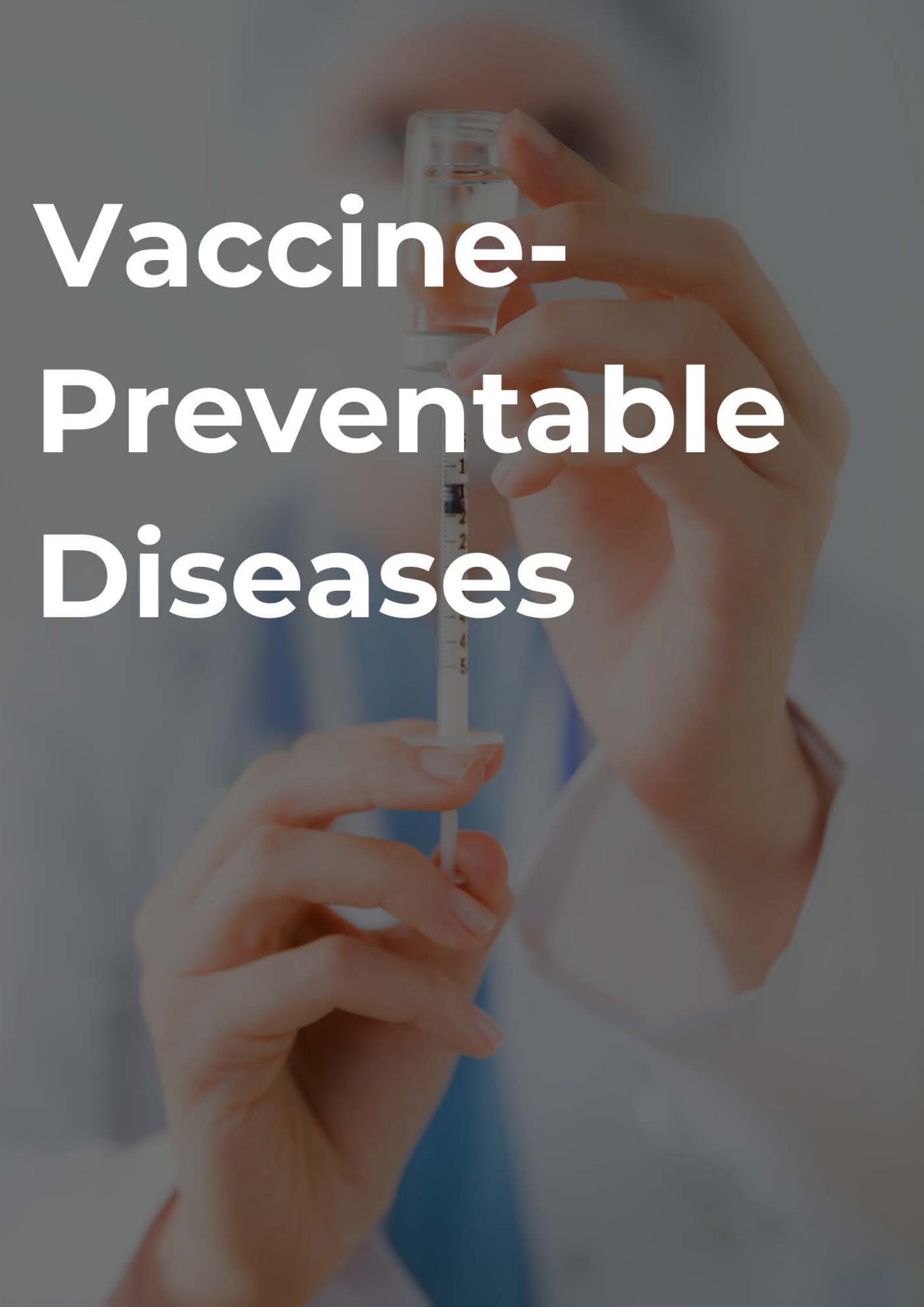

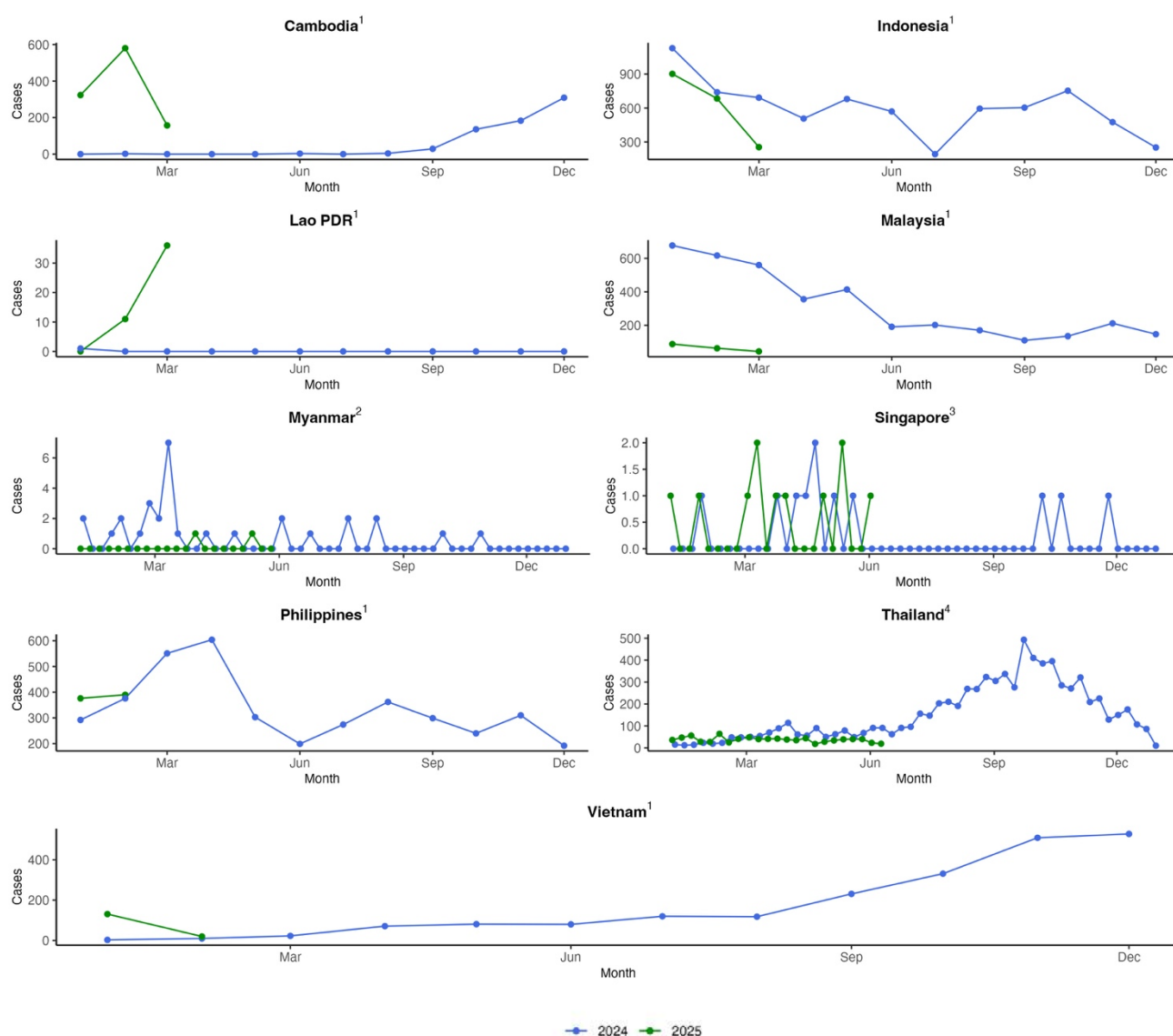
Measles Cases in the ASEAN Region

From December 29, 2024 to June 7, 2025 (Epi-Week 23, 2025)

Key Findings

- The **ASEAN** region reported **20** new measles cases in Epiweek 23, 2025.
- Up to June 7, 2025, the region reported **4,933** total cases with **0%** CFR.
- Mostly measles cases in the ASEAN Region slightly decrease compared to the same period on the previous year.
