

This report is based on media monitoring of infectious and emerging diseases globally and within ASEAN Member States, to enhance pandemic and epidemic preparedness and response in the ASEAN Region. We publish this report three times a week.

Regional Situation

Dengue

- **Indonesia:** As of June 2026, Kotawaringin Timur District, Central Kalimantan Province, Indonesia reported 93 dengue hemorrhagic fever (DHF) cases and a total of 139 dengue infections, including dengue fever and dengue shock syndrome (Tintaborneo, 2026). The highest DHF incidence occurred in June (25 cases). Health authorities urge residents to participate in performing control measures and to seek medical care promptly if fever and warning symptoms appear. [\[Full article\]](#)

Boyolali District, Central Java Province, reported 287 dengue cases from January to June 2026, including 40 DHF cases, two dengue shock syndrome (DSS) cases, and one death (Solopos, 2026). This represents a marked decline from 1,023 cases and four deaths during the same period in 2025. Sambu (51 cases) and Ngemplak (33) reported the highest case counts. Health authorities continue vector control and school-based campaigns. [\[Full article\]](#)

- **Malaysia:** Penang recorded 946 dengue cases as of June 20, 2026, up from 629 in the same period last year (The Star, 2026). One death has been reported this year, down from three in the same period in 2025. Authorities launched the Mega Anti-Aedes Gotong-Royong Programme and promoted the Dengue-Free Community initiative. The **Sepang City** Council in Selangor reported 70 dengue cases across two districts, Daria Garden Phases 7–8 (26 cases) and Cyberia Smart Homes (44 cases), as of epidemiological week 25 (June 28, 2026) (Sin Chew Daily, 2026). Authorities emphasized environmental hygiene, urged the elimination of mosquito breeding sites, and promoted five measures: source reduction, community cleanups, insecticide spraying, repellents, and protective clothing. - The **Philippines**: Iloilo City reported 140 dengue cases, including one death, from January 1 to June 27, 2026, a 45.3% decrease from 256 cases during the same period in 2025 (Philippine News Agency, 2026). The decline was attributed to misting operations, weekly cleanup drives, and distribution of sprayers and Olyset screens to schools and daycare centers. Authorities continue to encourage sustained barangay-level cleanup efforts to eliminate mosquito breeding sites during the rainy season. [[Full article](#)]
- **Viet Nam**: Dak Lak Province recorded over 1,150 dengue cases as of June 2026, including 105 new cases, up 22 from previous week (Vietnam.vn, 2026). The Central Highlands Regional General Hospital has treated 237 patients since January and is currently managing 42 cases, including 13 with warning signs. Authorities urge timely care, avoidance of self-treatment, and monitoring of warning symptoms. [[Full article](#)]

Hanoi reported 493 dengue cases in the first half of 2026, an increase of 183 compared to the same period in 2025 (Vietnam.vn, 2026). Despite the rise, Hanoi CDC reported that transmissions remain under control, with preventive health activities meeting and exceeding set targets. [[Full article](#)]

Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD)

- **Viet Nam** reported nearly 9,900 HFMD cases and one death nationwide between May 18 and June 18, 2026 (Tuổi Trẻ, 2026). Since December 14, 2025, almost 55,000 cases and 10 deaths have been recorded, double last year's same period. The Ministry of Health continues close monitoring and plans to strengthen professional guidelines on prevention, control, nutrition, and public health to address the rising burden. Hanoi recorded 3,793 HFMD cases as of mid-2026, an increase of 806 compared to the same period in 2025 (Vietnam.vn, 2026). The Hanoi CDC has maintained intensive prevention and control measures. Authorities continue close monitoring of global, national, and local disease trends to ensure timely response and strengthen public health preparedness. [[Full article](#)]

HIV/AIDS

- **Indonesia**: Mukomuko District, Bengkulu Province, reported 30 HIV/AIDS cases, including four deaths so far this year, including 24 undergoing treatments; two have been lost to follow-up (Radar Utara, 2026). Health authorities emphasize risks of unsafe sexual behavior and urge early testing, adherence to therapy, and community awareness to prevent transmission. [[Full article](#)]

Leptospirosis

- The **Philippines**: Iloilo Province reported 62 leptospirosis cases and seven deaths from January to June 2026, a 7% increase from 58 cases and two deaths in the same period last year (Panay News, 2026). Fatalities occurred in Dueñas (2), and one each in Dingle, Oton, Barotac Nuevo, Concepcion, and San Dionisio. Most cases affected adults aged 20–49. Authorities urge to avoid floodwater, using protective gear, and seeking prompt care; DOH advises against self-medication with antibiotics. [[Full article](#)]



Malaria

- **Indonesia:** Teluk Pandan Subdistrict, Pesawaran District, Lampung Province, reported 568 confirmed malaria cases in Hanura from January to May 2026, highlighting continued endemic transmission in the area (Lampung Tribun News, 2026). Most infections were caused by *Plasmodium vivax*. Health authorities strengthened surveillance, expanded rapid diagnostic testing to community health cadres, and emphasized early detection and treatment adherence to reduce transmission. Measles

- **Indonesia:** Mempawah District, West Kalimantan Province reported 258 suspected measles cases from January to June 2026, with 11 confirmed positive through laboratory testing (Pontianak Tribun News, 2026). Suspected cases were detected across nearly all subdistricts. Health authorities urge residents to complete measles immunization schedules and seek medical care promptly if symptoms appear. Pertussis

- **Viet Nam:** Hanoi reported 61 pertussis cases in the first half of 2026, an increase of 48 compared to the same period in 2025 (Vietnam.vn, 2026). The Hanoi CDC has conducted daily surveillance visits, hospital monitoring visits, and outbreak inspections. Authorities continue to monitor global, national, and local disease trends to ensure timely prevention and strengthen public health measures. [[Full article](#)]

Typhoid

- The **Philippines:** The Iloilo City Epidemiological Surveillance Unit (ICESU) reported 11 typhoid fever cases from January 1 to June 27, 2026, a decline compared to 35 cases in the same period in 2025 (Philippine News Agency, 2026). Health officials attributed the reduction to intensified misting activities in barangays and weekly cleanup drives. [[Full article](#)]

Global Situation

Dengue

- **Bangladesh:** The Ministry of Health reported 5,924 dengue cases and 18 deaths as of June 30, 2026, with infections rising sharply from 715 cases and one death in May to 2,907 cases and 13 deaths in June (Reuters, 2026). Experts warn cases in Dhaka may double in July and increase three to fourfold by August, with higher risks in districts outside the capital. Authorities are intensifying mosquito control, hospital preparedness, and public awareness, while entomologists urge a nationwide early warning system. [[Full article](#)]
- **Sri Lanka** reported 56,422 dengue cases nationwide as of July 1, 2026, with DENV-2 identified as the dominant circulating serotype (Mongabay, 2026). The rising caseload is straining the healthcare system, while experts highlight unplanned urbanization, climate change, and the adaptive evolution of *Aedes* mosquitoes as contributing factors. Public health officials continue vector control and surveillance efforts to mitigate transmission amid increasing regional risk. [[Full article](#)]



Colombo reported 2,343 dengue cases as of July 2, 2026, accounting for 4.5% of the national total; construction sites identified as the most common breeding grounds (Daily Mirror, 2026). The Public Health Department conducts daily mosquito control inspections, while authorities emphasize community cooperation alongside institutional efforts to reduce transmission and manage the outbreak. Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD)

- **Japan:** Saitama Prefecture reported HFMD cases reaching 5.10 per sentinel site during week 26 (June 22–28, 2026), exceeding the national alert threshold of 5 for the first time since 2024 (Saitama Prefecture, 2026). Infants under one year comprising about 60% of total cases. Health authorities urge strict cough etiquette, thorough handwashing, and hygiene practices in childcare facilities to prevent further spread. [[Full article](#)]

Malaria

- **India:** Potka Block, East Singhbhum District, Jharkhand reported 150 cerebral malaria cases in one week, including nine newly confirmed cases and four child deaths (ETV Bharat, 2026), 2026). Health teams provide treatment, distribute mosquito nets, intensify surveillance. State government directed districts to implement plans, strengthen testing, ensure medicine supplies, expand vector control measures. [[Full article](#)]
- **Ukraine:** Lviv Region reported two imported tropical malaria cases on July 1, 2026, involving a mother and daughter hospitalized after returning from Zanzibar, Tanzania (Zaxid.net, 2026). Symptoms appeared June 29 after returning on June 22; both had not taken malaria chemoprophylaxis and remain in serious condition. These are the fourth imported cases this year, all linked to travel to Zanzibar. Authorities urge antimalarial prophylaxis and repellents before travel. [[Full article](#)]

Measles

- **Bangladesh** reported five new suspected measles deaths on July 2, 2026, raising the cumulative toll to 724 fatalities (631 suspected, 93 confirmed) (The Daily Star, 2026). In the same 24-hour period, 965 suspected and 154 confirmed cases were recorded, bringing totals to 102,993 suspected and 12,286 confirmed infections nationwide. Since March 15, 86,411 suspected patients have been hospitalized, with 82,759 recovered. Authorities continue surveillance and patient care efforts. [[Full article](#)]
- **Canada:** Quebec confirmed 27 measles cases, mostly in the Quebec City area, with exposures at Hospital ER, market stores, and pharmacies in Pont-Rouge and Donnacona (Beritaja, 2026). Additional cases have been detected in Montreal, Laval, and other regions. Health officials emphasize measles' high transmissibility and warn of severe complications, urging vaccination and vigilance to prevent further spread. [[Full article](#)]
- **Japan:** Toyama Prefecture confirmed two new measles cases in the Takaoka Welfare Center jurisdiction, involving a man and a woman in their 40s (NTV News Japan, 2026). The man was a contact of a previously reported patient, while the woman developed fever and rash without overseas travel history, leaving the infection route unclear. This brings the prefecture's total number of cases to seven this year. Authorities urge residents with suspected symptoms to contact medical institutions by phone before seeking care. Mpox

- The **United Kingdom (UK)**: Northern Ireland reported 21 confirmed mpox cases in the last three weeks, all clade 1b, the first local detection of this strain (BBC News, 2026). Most infections occurred among men who have sex with men. Health authorities urge eligible individuals to seek vaccination at sexual health clinics, while ongoing surveillance and response align with wider UK and European trends. This marked a sharp rise compared to nine cases reported since 2023. [\[Full article\]](#)

Rabies

- **Ethiopia**: Hossana, Southern Nations Region reported a rabies outbreak in late June 2026, causing three child deaths and around 80 hospitalizations following dog bites (Tiderne, 2026). Health officials emphasized mass dog vaccination, prompt human treatment, and strengthened surveillance as part of Ethiopia's national rabies control strategy. [\[Full article\]](#)

Typhoid

- **India**: Ahmedabad reported 188 typhoid cases from June 1–28, 2026 (Times of India, 2026). Water quality surveillance tested 49,238 samples for chlorine, with 48 showing no residual, and 7,085 bacteriological samples, of which 70 were unfit. Authorities continue monitoring and preventive measures to safeguard public health. [\[Full article\]](#)

West Nile Virus (WNV)

- The **United States (US)** reported 48 human WNV cases as of July 2, 2026, including 38 severe neuroinvasive illnesses, marking the earliest surge in decades (Toronto Sun, 2026). Arizona accounts for 32 cases, with Maricopa County reporting 29 cases and four deaths. Activity has been detected in 23 states, the highest in 10 years. Health officials attribute the rise to warm, wet conditions and urge mosquito bite prevention through repellents, protective clothing, and eliminating standing water. [\[Full article\]](#)

Fort Bend County, Texas confirmed its first human case of WNV in 2026 in zip code 77478 (Fox 26 Houston, 2026). The county's Mosquito and Vector Control Program continues year-round surveillance and targeted control measures to reduce transmission risk. [\[Full article\]](#)

Mississippi health authorities reported its first human case of WNV in 2026 in Hancock County (Memphis Noticias, 2026). The risk of transmission increases during summer, and authorities continue surveillance and public advisories to limit spread. [\[Full article\]](#)

Bear River Health Department, Utah reported the first human case of WNV in 2026 in Box Elder County (ABC4 News, 2026). No patient details were released. Authorities urge residents to follow the "5 Ds" of mosquito safety. Public advisories continue as prevention remains the primary control measure. [\[Full article\]](#)
