

This report is based on media monitoring of infectious and emerging diseases globally and within ASEAN Member States, to enhance pandemic and epidemic preparedness and response in the ASEAN Region. We publish this report three times a week.

Regional Situation

Dengue

- **Cambodia:** The Ministry of Health (MOH) reported 578 dengue cases in Koh Thom District, Kandal Province between June 16 and July 4, 2026; no deaths were reported (Cambodianess, 2026). In response, the MOH intensified mosquito control, hospital preparedness, and public awareness campaigns, noting a sharp increase compared with 15–20 cases reported in 2025. [\[Full article\]](#)

Kampong Speu Province reported 927 dengue cases as of early July 2026, an 84% increase compared with the same period in 2025, including two deaths (Khmer Times, 2026). Health authorities strengthened community education and vector control and urged residents to eliminate breeding sites and seek prompt medical care. [\[Full article\]](#)

- **Indonesia:** Kapuas Hulu District, West Kalimantan Province, reported 286 dengue cases as of July 3, 2026 (Pontianak Post, 2026). Most patients have recovered, and one death has recorded. Health authorities urged residents to eliminate mosquito breeding sites and maintain environmental hygiene to prevent further transmission. [\[Full article\]](#)

West Kotawaringin District, Central Kalimantan Province, reported 83 dengue cases across six subdistricts as of early July 2026; no deaths were reported (Detik, 2026). N. Health authorities emphasized that fogging alone is insufficient and promoted the 3M Plus strategy to eliminate breeding sites and encourage early medical care. [\[Full article\]](#)

- **Malaysia:** The iDengue surveillance system reported 39,878 dengue cases as of July 3, 2026, a 27% increase compared with the same period in 2025, with weekly cases exceeding 1,000 (Says, 2026). Selangor reported the highest burden (17,701), followed by Kuala Lumpur/Putrajaya (7,191) and Johor (4,591). Deaths reached 23, and the Health Ministry attributed the increase to DENV-3 predominance. - The **Philippines:** Infanta, Quezon Province, reported 43 dengue cases since January 2026, including one child death (Ronda Balita Probinsya, 2026). The Municipal Health Office promoted the “4:00 o’clock habit” campaign for daily community clean-up to eliminate mosquito breeding sites. Authorities urged parental vigilance, early medical consultation for symptomatic children, and environmental sanitation to prevent transmission. [\[Full article\]](#)



Capiz Province reported 313 dengue cases as of epi-week 25 (January 4–June 27, 2026), including four new cases and two deaths (95.7 Brigada Roxas Capiz, 2026). The most affected age group was 10–19 years (20.8%). Roxas City (60 cases, one death) and Tapaz (58 cases, one death) recorded the highest burdens. Health authorities continued surveillance and community prevention campaigns. [\[Full article\]](#)

- **Singapore:** The National Environment Agency (NEA) reported a 135-case dengue cluster at Countryside Road/Lentor Avenue in week 26 of 2026 (Channel News Asia, 2026). NEA also reported 1,311 dengue cases nationwide as of July 6, 2026, down from 4,380 cases in the same period of 2025, and detected 86 mosquito breeding habitats, intensified vector control, and urged residents to eliminate stagnant water. - **Viet Nam:** Hanoi recorded 555 dengue cases from January to July 3, 2026, a 68% increase compared with 331 cases during the same period in 2025 (Vietnam.vn, 2026). During June 26–July 3 period, 62 cases were reported across 33 wards. The Hanoi CDC warned of continued increases during the peak dengue season. [\[Full article\]](#)

Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD)

- **Viet Nam:** Hanoi recorded 3,885 HFMD cases from January to July 3, 2026, an increase compared with 3,046 cases during the same period in 2025 (Vietnam.vn, 2026). During June 26–July 3 period, 92 cases were reported across 60 wards. Health authorities urged preventive measures, environmental hygiene, and timely vaccination. [\[Full article\]](#)

HIV/AIDS

- **Indonesia:** North Lombok District, West Nusa Tenggara Province, reported 31 people living with HIV receiving treatment as of mid-2026, including two new cases detected this year (Radar Lombok, 2026). Health authorities highlighted limited screening among key populations and focused on strengthening care, antiretroviral therapy adherence, mobile VCT services, and prevention programs. Malaria

- **Indonesia:** Bintan District, Riau Islands, recorded 178 malaria cases from January to June 2026, a marked increase from 14 cases in 2025 (Tribun Batam, 2026). Of these, 142 patients required hospitalization and 36 received outpatient care, with Mantang and Teluk Bintan most affected. Health authorities promoted environmental hygiene, bed nets, and mosquito repellents. [\[Full article\]](#)

Mimika District, Papua Province, reported 83,242 confirmed malaria cases from January to July 2026 among 653,152 tests, with a positivity rate of 12.7% (Salam Papua, 2026). *Plasmodium vivax* (42.5%) and *P. falciparum* (41.5%) were the predominant species. Health authorities urged communities to maintain health awareness and environmental hygiene and advised patients to seek replacement medication if vomiting occurs within 30 minutes after malaria treatment. West Bangka District, Bangka Belitung, conducted malaria screening for 386 residents in Jebu Laut, Kelabat Village, Parittiga Subdistrict, on July 3 and 6, 2026 (Tribun Batam, 2026). From January–June 2026, the district had reported 26 malaria cases, increasing from 11 in 2025 and 6 in 2024. Health authorities implemented screening, larvicide spraying, and community clean-up campaigns. [\[Full article\]](#)



Global Situation

Ebola

- **Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC):** The Ministry of Health reported 1,561 confirmed Ebola cases as of July 7, 2026, across Ituri, North Kivu, and South Kivu, including 506 deaths (case fatality rate: 32.4%), 628 patients isolated or hospitalized, and 253 recoveries (Outbreak News Today, 2026). Contact tracing coverage reached 81.6%, with ongoing response efforts focused on treatment capacity, infection prevention, and community engagement. [\[Full article\]](#)

Avian Influenza

- **China:** Hongkong's Centre for Health Protection reported a human H9N2 avian influenza case in July 2026 in a 1-year-old girl from Guangdong Province, with symptom onset on June 12 (CIDRAP, 2026). In the past six months, 16 infections were confirmed globally, including 12 in mainland China. Since 2015, WHO documented 164 cases in the Western Pacific, including two deaths. Crimean-Congo Hemorrhagic Fever (CCHF)

- **Iraq:** Kirkuk Province confirmed its fourth CCHF case on July 6, 2026, involving a 35-year-old woman from Al-Hawija District (Shafaq News, 2026). She is receiving medical care under approved health protocols. [\[Full article\]](#)

Nineveh Province confirmed a new CCHF case on July 6, 2026, involving a 32-year-old woman admitted to hospital in Mosul for isolation and treatment, bringing the provincial total to 12 cases in 2026 (Shafaq News, 2026). Nationally, Iraq reported 158 infections and 10 deaths since January, with Dhi Qar most affected (74 cases). [\[Full article\]](#)

Dengue

- **Bangladesh:** The Directorate General of Health Services reported 196 new dengue hospitalizations as of July 7, 2026, with the highest numbers in Barishal (66) and Chattogram (41) (Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha, 2026). Total cases reached 7,306, including 19 deaths and 6,676 recoveries. Males accounted for 61.5% of cases. In 2025, Bangladesh recorded 102,861 cases and 413 deaths. [\[Full article\]](#)
- **India:** Patna District, Bihar, confirmed 45 dengue cases as of July 5, 2026, increasing from 23 cases on June 30, with 22 new infections reported in early July (Jagran, 2026). Most cases were identified in urban areas. Authorities strengthened surveillance, larval control, diagnostic services, and public awareness measures. [\[Full article\]](#)
- **Sri Lanka** reported 7,038 new dengue cases during July 1–6, 2026, with cumulative cases reaching 62,422 since January and 39 deaths (Outbreak News Today, 2026). Colombo (12,663) and Gampaha (12,582) districts reported the highest burdens. Dengue transmission remains associated with monsoon seasons, with the Western Province most affected due to urbanization and mosquito breeding conditions. [\[Full article\]](#)



- **Taiwan (Province of China):** The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported 83 dengue cases, including seven local and 76 imported cases as of July 6, 2026, with recent infections linked to travelers from Viet Nam and Cambodia (Radio Taiwan Internasional, 2026). Authorities warned that El Niño-related temperature and rainfall changes may increase mosquito breeding and virus transmission. [[Full article](#)]

Measles

- **Bangladesh:** The Directorate General of Health Services reported one additional child death with measles-like symptoms, raising the combined toll to 742 (93 confirmed, 649 suspected) (The Business, 2026). During the same 24-hour period, 819 new suspected cases and 173 confirmed infections were recorded, bringing totals to 107,384 suspected and 12,964 confirmed nationwide. Since March 15, 90,522 suspected patients have been hospitalized, with 86,844 recoveries, while Dhaka hospitals continue to manage rising pediatric admissions. [[Full article](#)]
- **Maldives:** The Health Protection Agency reported 121 measles cases nationwide, including 55 cases detected in Malé last week (Edition, 2026). The outbreak mainly affects individuals aged 15–35 years. Authorities implemented a measles-rubella vaccination campaign, administering 5,495 doses, and promoted isolation, mask use, and reduced gatherings to limit transmission. [[Full article](#)]
- **South Africa:** The National Institute for Communicable Diseases (NICD) reported 2,476 laboratory-confirmed measles cases between December 29, 2025 and June 21, 2026 (Independent Online, 2026). Most cases occurred among children aged 1–14 years (70.6%), with increasing infections among adults (>15 years, 17.7%). Western Cape and Free State were most affected. In response, authorities intensified vaccination, surveillance, and outbreak response measures. [[Full article](#)]
- **The United States (US):** Virginia confirmed 22 new measles cases as of July 7, 2026, bringing the statewide total to 167 cases in 2026 (CBS19 News, 2026). All new cases were linked to the ongoing outbreak in Buckingham and Cumberland counties. Among total cases, 160 patients were unvaccinated, eight were hospitalized, and no deaths were reported. Authorities continue surveillance, contact tracing, and MMR vaccination outreach to address immunity gaps. [[Full article](#)]

Arizona reported seven measles cases among detainees at a Detention Center in Pinal County on July 7, 2026 (AZ Family, 2026). The outbreak represents localized transmission in a congregate setting, prompting quarantine measures, contact tracing, medical monitoring, and vaccination efforts. Arizona has recorded 100 measles cases statewide in 2026, including previous cases in Pinal facilities. [[Full article](#)]

Mpox

- **Taiwan (Province in China):** The CDC reported four new mpox cases, including two local and two imported infections among men aged 20–40 (Yahoo Taiwan, 2026). One imported case involved the Ib variant after travel to Hong Kong, marking Taiwan’s second Ib case. Cumulatively, 19 cases were reported in 2026 (15 local, 4 imported). Authorities urged vaccination among high-risk groups. [[Full article](#)]
