



This report is based on media monitoring of infectious and emerging diseases globally and within ASEAN Member States, to enhance pandemic and epidemic preparedness and response in the ASEAN Region. We publish this report three times a week.

## Regional Situation

### Dengue

- **Indonesia:** Kembangan Subdistrict, West Jakarta, reported a 60% decline of dengue cases compared to the same period in 2025, with 89 cases reported versus 227 last year, following the Wolbachia-infected mosquito release in October 2024, alongside intensive source reduction campaigns (CNN Indonesia, 2026). Authorities attribute the decline to Wolbachia implementation and vector control, with only three cases recorded in June 2026 compared to 49 in June 2025. [\[Full article\]](#)
- **Singapore:** In the week ending June 6, 2026, Singapore reported 81 dengue cases, the highest weekly count this year, bringing the cumulative total to 830 cases (Yan.sg, 2026). Eight active zones remain. DENV-3 is the predominant serotype, raising transmission risk due to low herd immunity. Authorities continue Project *Wolbachia*, issue prevention guidelines, and urge community cooperation in mosquito source reduction. [\[Full article\]](#)
- **Viet Nam:** Ho Chi Minh City recorded nearly 18,000 dengue cases and four deaths as of May 31, 2026, a 65% increase compared with the same period in 2025, with infections reported across all communes and wards (VnExpress, 2026). Two recent fatalities in Lam Dong prompted increased vaccination demand. Health authorities have intensified mosquito eradication, spraying, and surveillance activities. Experts warn of shorter epidemic cycles and emphasize combined prevention measures, including vaccination, vector control, and early medical consultation. [\[Full article\]](#)

**Hanoi** recorded 26 dengue cases across 21 wards from May 29 to June 5, 2026, a slight decrease from 27 the previous week (HCDC, 2026). Cumulatively, 339 cases and no deaths have been reported this year, higher than 271 cases in the same period of 2025. Hanoi CDC continues surveillance, sanitation, and spraying campaigns, and coordinates community activities ahead of ASEAN Dengue Prevention Day on 15 June. [\[Full article\]](#)



## **Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD)**

- **Viet Nam:** Ca Mau Province reported 1,472 HFMD cases, a 149% increase from the same period in 2025; one death was reported in a 3-year-old boy (Lao Dong, 2026). Following the fatality, health authorities conducted inspections in Hong Dan and Vinh Loc communes and strengthened response, treatment guidance, and surveillance. The provincial government enhanced epidemic monitoring, ensured medical supplies, and increased community awareness to reduce severe cases and deaths. [\[Full article\]](#)

**Hanoi** recorded 97 HFMD cases across 54 wards from May 29 to June 5, 2026, a decrease from 164 the previous week (HCDC, 2026). Cumulatively, 3,480 cases and no deaths have been reported this year, higher than 2,727 cases in the same period of 2025. Sixty-five outbreaks have been recorded in 2026, with one still active. Hanoi CDC continues surveillance, outbreak control, and sanitation measures in schools and communities to limit transmission. [\[Full article\]](#)

## **Malaria**

- **Indonesia:** West Bangka District, Bangka Belitung Province reported 26 malaria cases so far in 2026, a marked increase compared with 11 cases in 2025 and six in 2024 (Trubun News Bangka, 2026). Health authorities conducted larval surveys, mass blood screening with rapid diagnostic tests, indoor residual spraying, and distribution of insecticide-treated nets. Community education and strengthened surveillance through village health cadres were implemented to support early detection and reduce transmission. [\[Full article\]](#)

## **Rabies**

- The **Philippines:** Cebu City reported its first human rabies death, a senior citizen who delayed seeking medical care after an animal bite in October 2025 (SunStar Cebu, 2026). Authorities are relying on emergency vaccine loans and local procurement while urging residents to treat all animal bites as medical emergencies and seek immediate post-exposure prophylaxis. - **Viet Nam:** Hanoi reported a case of rabies in Doai Phuong Commune between May 29 to June 5, 2026, involving one person receiving post-exposure prophylaxis (HCDC, 2026). Authorities continue surveillance, outbreak investigation, and coordination with veterinary services. [\[Full article\]](#)

## **Global Situation**

### **Crimean-Congo Hemorrhagic Fever (CCHF)**

- **Iraq:** The Ministry of Health reported 145 confirmed cases of hemorrhagic fever and nine deaths nationwide on June 8, 2026. During the previous week, 40 new cases and one death were recorded. Dhi Qar reported the highest number of cases (21), followed by Muthanna (6), while Basra reported three cases and one death. Several other provinces reported sporadic cases. Authorities continue awareness campaigns, early detection, and treatment efforts, while promoting preventive measures, including safe meat handling, tick control, and the use of protective clothing. **Dhi Qar Province** reported 11 new cases of viral hemorrhagic fever and one death on June 8, 2026 (Hatha Youm, 2026). Since January, the province has recorded 74 cases and nine deaths, bringing the cumulative total to 83 cases overall. The disease is transmitted through tick bites or contact with infected animal blood or meat, placing butchers, livestock breeders, and slaughterhouse workers at increased risk. Health authorities continue surveillance and treatment efforts while promoting preventive measures to reduce transmission. [\[Full article\]](#)

The **Nineveh** Health Directorate confirmed a new case of CCHF on Juni 7, 2026, in a 57-year-old man from Sharqat District, Saladin Province (Shafaq News, 2026). The patient was admitted to a local Hospital and later transferred to a Specialized Hospital in Mosul. This brings Nineveh's total to four CCHF cases in 2026; two previous patients from Qayyarah have fully recovered. Authorities continue surveillance and treatment efforts. [\[Full article\]](#)

### **Dengue**

- **Sri Lanka** health authorities reported nearly 37,000 dengue cases nationwide so far this year, surpassing the same period in 2025 (Ada Derana, 2025). Nearly half of infections were reported from the Western Province, with Colombo (22%) and Gampaha (17%) districts most affected. The National Dengue Control Unit launched a special mosquito control programme from 9–10 June across 14 districts and 72 MOH divisions, including inspections, issuance of red notices, and legal action against breeding sites. ### **Leptospirosis**

- **Mauritius** has reported 20 leptospirosis cases and five deaths since January 2026, resulting in a high fatality rate (Beacon Bio, 2026). The most recent death involved a 60-year-old gardener with underlying health conditions. Investigations identified more than 90 rat-infested sites in affected urban areas, with most cases occurring among high-risk occupational groups exposed to contaminated soil or water. Health authorities emphasize early diagnosis, timely treatment, personal protective measures, and strengthened environmental control measures. [\[Full article\]](#)

### **Measles**

- **Bangladesh:** The Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) reported three new suspected measles deaths on June 9, 2026, raising the cumulative toll to 631 fatalities (539 suspected, 92 confirmed) (Observer BD, 2026). In the same 24-hour period, 980 suspected cases and 54 confirmed infections were recorded, bringing totals to 81,084 suspected and 9,833 confirmed cases nationwide. Since March 15, 66,170 suspected patients have been hospitalized, with 62,292 discharged after recovery. Authorities continue surveillance and patient care efforts. [\[Full article\]](#)

- **Canada:** Measles outbreak in Quebec has reached 16 confirmed cases since it was declared on March 24 (Montreal Gazette, 2026). The most recent exposure occurred on 4 June at the CHU Sainte-Justine emergency department, with exposed individuals advised monitoring for symptoms until June 25. Health authorities continue surveillance and public advisories, emphasizing early recognition of symptoms to prevent further transmission. [[Full article](#)]
- **Maldives:** The Health Protection Agency (HPA) confirmed four new measles cases in Greater Malé on June 9, 2026, bringing the total to 15 cases this year (Edition.mv, 2026). Authorities initiated investigations, contact tracing, and vaccination of exposed individuals. HPA urges mask use, isolation of suspected cases, and prompt medical care, and is preparing a vaccination campaign for those lacking full two-dose immunization amid rising regional activity. - The **United States (US):** Lancaster County, Pennsylvania reported 16 new measles cases in the past week, bringing the county total to 28 since late April and 36 year-to-date (Lancaster Online, 2026). Statewide, 62 cases have been confirmed, with Lebanon County reporting the highest per-capita incidence. None of the cases were fully vaccinated with two MMR doses. Health authorities continue contact tracing and vaccination campaigns, emphasizing the need for 95% coverage to maintain herd immunity amid rising national cases. [[Full article](#)]

### ***Meningococcal Disease***

- The **United Kingdom (UK):** A postgraduate student at the University of Surrey was diagnosed with meningococcal meningitis (GB News, 2026). The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) confirmed no link to previous outbreaks. Preventive antibiotics and vaccination are being offered to close contacts. Students and staff have been advised to remain vigilant for symptoms and seek prompt medical attention. [[Full article](#)]

### ***Mpox***

- **Hong Kong (SAR):** The Centre for Health Protection (CHP) confirmed a locally acquired mpox case in a 43-year-old man linked to Hutong, Mong Kok, and high-risk hotel contacts (RTHK, 2026). The patient developed genital ulcers on June 1, tested positive after attending a Department of Health clinic, and is currently stable in isolation at Princess Margaret Hospital. The source of infection remains undetermined. CHP continues epidemiological investigations, has traced over 300 Hutong visitors, and will report the case to WHO. [[Full article](#)]
- **Pakistan:** Lahore reported two new mpox cases on June 9, 2026, in 22-year-old women admitted to Mayo Hospital, bringing the city total to 54 cases this year (Samaa TV, 2026). The cases are locally acquired with no travel history, indicating community transmission. Sindh Province has reported 34 cases and nine deaths in 2026, with Khairpur most affected, while no cases have been reported in Islamabad or Rawalpindi. Authorities advise quarantine and prompt medical consultation for symptomatic individuals. [[Full article](#)]



**Bahawalpur** reported a suspected mpox case on June 9, 2026, in a relative of the patient admitted in Bahawal Victoria Hospital (BVH) raising the possibility of a third hospital-linked infection (Pro Pakistani, 2026). The patient has been isolated, with samples sent to Lahore for laboratory confirmation. A BVH staff nurse previously infected has recovered but remains under mandatory 21-day isolation. Health authorities continue monitoring, testing, and enforcement of isolation protocols. [[Full article](#)]

### **Pertussis**

- **The United States (US):** Guam reported 17 cases of pertussis as of June 8, 2026, including one newly confirmed case since May 26 (Relief Web, 2026). Four patients have been hospitalized, and three cases have epidemiological links. No deaths have been reported. Cases span multiple age groups, with many occurring among unvaccinated or partially vaccinated individuals. The Department of Public Health and Social Services maintains a red alert, promotes vaccination across all age groups, and encourages early care-seeking for compatible symptoms. [[Full article](#)]
- **Russia:** The Samara Region reported 10 pertussis cases among children as of May 2026; seven were from the regional capital (AIF Samara, 2026). Although substantially lower than the 747 cases reported in 2023, health officials noted a potential surge from 38 cases in 2025. Pertussis poses severe risks for infants, including respiratory distress and complications. Rospotrebnadzor emphasized timely vaccination and booster doses as the most effective measures to prevent transmission. [[Full article](#)]

### **West Nile Virus (WNV)**

- **India:** On June 8, 2026, a 70-year-old man from Ernakulam District was reported died of West Nile fever at Kalamassery Medical College, marking the second death in Kerala within a week (Thejas News, 2026). The virus is transmitted by Culex mosquitoes from infected birds and was first reported in the state in 2011. Health authorities urged residents to seek prompt medical care for fever or related symptoms and to eliminate mosquito breeding sites to reduce transmission risk. [[Full article](#)]
