

This report is based on media monitoring of infectious and emerging diseases globally and within ASEAN Member States, to enhance pandemic and epidemic preparedness and response in the ASEAN Region. We publish this report three times a week.

Regional Situation

Dengue

- **Indonesia:** Jember District, East Java Province reported 273 confirmed dengue hemorrhagic fever (DHF) cases as of epi-week 23 of 2026 (June 15), including three deaths, among 698 total dengue infections (Kiss FM Jember, 2026). The incidence rate reached 26 per 100,000 population, 2.6 times above the national threshold of 10, while the case fatality rate remained at 0.4%, below the national limit of 0.5%. Authorities urged intensified control measures and larvicide use. [[Full article](#)]

Bangka District, Bangka Belitung Islands Province reported an increase in dengue cases from 102 in May to 114 in early June 2026, including one death (Babel Pos, 2026). The highest burden was recorded in Belinyu (34 cases), followed by Kenanga (19), Petaling (14), and other health centers. Authorities urged intensified mosquito eradication and community participation in environmental sanitation. [[Full article](#)]

- The **Philippines:** Benguet Province recorded 666 dengue cases as of June 6, 2026, a 20% decline compared with 837 cases in 2025 (Philippine Information Agency, 2026). Despite the overall decrease, Atok municipality reported a 289% increase with 144 cases, while Kibungan, Tuba, Bakun, and Itogon also noted rises. The Provincial Health Office continues weekly and monthly surveillance, strengthens school-based awareness campaigns, and promotes the 4S strategy to reduce transmission. [[Full article](#)]

Imus City, Cavite reported 258 dengue cases as of June 17, 2026, including 180 confirmed, 42 probable, and 36 suspected cases (City Government of Imus, 2026). Health authorities emphasized the 5S strategy while urging residents to report symptoms promptly. [[Full article](#)]

- **Viet Nam:** Can Tho City has reported 3,038 dengue cases so far in 2026, including 252 severe cases, with no deaths (VietBao, 2026). To mark ASEAN Dengue Prevention Day, health authorities conducted a public rally emphasizing multisectoral collaboration among government agencies, health services, and communities. Control measures include environmental sanitation, source reduction, and public awareness activities. [[Full article](#)]



Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD)

- **Viet Nam:** Ho Chi Minh City recorded 1,160 HFMD cases in epi-week 23 of 2026, representing a 13.3% increase compared with the previous four-week average and bringing the cumulative total to 20,406 cases this year (Sức Khỏe Đời Sống, 2026). A severe case in a 10-year-old girl highlights risks beyond the usual under-5 age group. Health authorities advise early recognition of severe symptoms, strict hygiene, disinfection of household items, and school exclusion for infected children to reduce transmission. HIV/AIDS

- **Indonesia:** Teluk Bintuni District, West Papua Province reported 70 new HIV cases from January to June 2026, bringing the cumulative total to 1,350 (Jubi, 2026). Health authorities warned that the actual number may be higher due to undetected infections, with only 2,500 of the targeted 18,000 residents screened this year. The Health Office is intensifying testing, evaluation, and collaboration with local leaders, police, and religious figures to strengthen HIV/AIDS prevention and control. [[Full article](#)]

Malaria

- **Indonesia:** Tanjungpinang Municipality, Riau Islands Province reported 129 malaria cases as of mid-June 2026, with 99 patients requiring hospitalization (Pemerintah Kota Tanjungpinang, 2026). Most cases were concentrated in Senggarang and Kampung Bugis. Local and provincial authorities, supported by national experts, initiated fogging, indoor residual spraying, and community education campaigns. [[Full article](#)]

Measles

- **Indonesia:** Jambi City, Jambi Province reported 681 suspected measles cases as of June 17, 2026, including 612 clinical diagnoses, five confirmed cases, 10 negative results, and 54 fever-rash cases (Antara News Jambi, 2026). Most cases occurred among children aged 5–9 years (213), followed by 2–4 years (176). Limited laboratory capacity has resulted in many diagnoses being based on clinical assessment. Health authorities continue treatment, contact tracing, family education, and catch-up immunization to reduce transmission. [[Full article](#)]

Typhoid

- The **Philippines:** The Department of Health reported 280 typhoid cases at the National Center for Mental Health (NCMH) in Mandaluyong as of June 16, 2026 (Philstar, 2026). Of these, 216 patients have recovered, while 12 remain under treatment and monitoring. DOH emphasize hygiene practices, particularly handwashing, to prevent further spread. [[Full article](#)]



Global Situation

Chikungunya

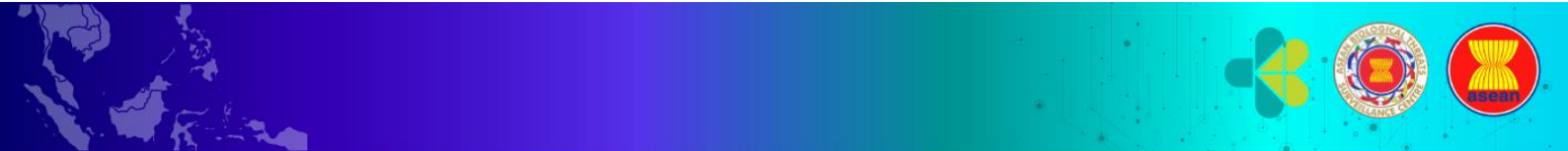
- **Spain:** Navarre reported 12 imported mosquito-borne infections, including five chikungunya cases among travelers returning from various countries (Diario de Navarra, 2026). Public Health officials recommend eliminating standing water, using repellents, wearing protective clothing, and maintaining preventive measures to reduce mosquito proliferation and the risk of local transmission. - The **United States (US):** Florida reported a travel-associated chikungunya case in Hillsborough County in mid-June 2026, bringing the district total to seven (Tropeninstitut, 2026). Cases were also reported in Alachua, Hernando, Miami-Dade (19), Monroe (2), Orange (2), and Palm Beach (3). Most infections were linked to travel from Cuba, Brazil, and Bolivia. Authorities continue surveillance and promote preventive measures for travelers. [[Full article](#)]

Crimean-Congo Hemorrhagic Fever (CCHF)

- **Iraq:** On June 17, 2026, the Ministry of Health confirmed two hemorrhagic fever cases in Erbil involving a 71-year-old man and his 39-year-old son, both infected after home animal slaughter (Rudaw, 2026). One patient is stable, while the other remains in critical condition. These are the first confirmed cases in the Kurdistan Region in 2026. Authorities advise avoiding unsafe slaughter practices and seeking prompt medical care. [[Full article](#)]
- **Russia:** Dagestan reported seven laboratory-confirmed CCHF cases, including three in Kizilyurt District (Ria Dagestan, 2026). Local authorities convened the Sanitary and Anti-Epidemic Commission to strengthen control measures, expanding acaricidal treatment in pastures and public areas, enhancing veterinary inspections, and increasing public awareness. - **Turkiye:** Sivas Province reported 26 confirmed CCHF cases, including five deaths. Nine patients remain hospitalized in stable condition at Sivas Cumhuriyet University Hospital (Tavkim, 2026). Authorities emphasize tick exposure risks, particularly in rural areas, and recommend protective measures, early medical care, and community awareness to reduce transmission. [[Full article](#)]

Dengue

- **India:** Kerala reported 3,565 confirmed and 10,428 probable dengue cases, with 17 confirmed and 15 probable deaths, in 2026 to date (The Hindu, 2026). More than half of reported cases occurred during May and June. In the past two-day, 173 cases were reported, including one death. Health authorities continue enhanced surveillance and monitoring as all four dengue serotypes circulate in the state. [[Full article](#)]



Palakkad District, Kerala, reported three dengue-related deaths within three days, a 43-year-old man from Karimpuzha, a 62-year-old woman from Ambalampadam, and a 74-year-old woman from Pattambi (Thejas News, 2026). In recent days, 543 residents sought treatment for suspected dengue, with the Mannarkkad region reporting the highest number of cases. Health authorities have intensified vector control activities and urged individuals with symptoms consistent to seek prompt medical attention.

Ahmedabad has reported 14 mosquito-borne disease cases as of June 14, 2026, including five dengue cases in June, compared with 23 cases in June 2025 (Nav Gujarat Samay, 2026). A cumulative 143 dengue cases have been recorded in 2026, down from 1,591 during the corresponding period in 2025. [\[Full article\]](#)

- **Sri Lanka:** The National Dengue Control Unit reported 42,807 dengue cases and 27 related deaths as of mid-June 2026, with women accounting for 77.8% of fatalities (News First, 2026). More than 2,000 premises, including schools, have faced legal action for mosquito breeding. Authorities continue the Special Dengue Control Programme, focusing on vector control, surveillance, enforcement, and community engagement to reduce dengue transmission. [\[Full article\]](#)
- **Spain:** Navarre has registered six imported dengue cases as of mid-June 2026 (Diario de Navarra, 2026). Public Health authorities advise travelers returning from tropical regions to prevent mosquito bites. Recommended measures include eliminating standing water, using repellents, wearing protective clothing, and consulting Foreign Health guidance before travel. [\[Full article\]](#)

Ebola

- **India:** A 52-year-old woman from Pala, Kerala, with a recent travel history to South Sudan was hospitalized with fever and placed under observation for suspected Ebola virus disease (Sathyam Online, 2026). She was transferred to Kottayam Medical College Hospital, and blood samples were sent to the National Institute of Virology in Pune for testing. Laboratory confirmation is pending. Leptospirosis

- **Fiji:** The Ministry of Health reported eight leptospirosis deaths so far in 2026, including three cases following severe weather during the Easter period (Fiji Village, 2026). Although cases have declined during the colder season, authorities continue surveillance and promote environmental sanitation measures to reduce rodent populations and prevent further transmission. Malaria

- **India:** Ahmedabad reported 93 cases of malaria from January to mid-June 2026, down from 915 cases in the same period of 2025. Eight cases were recorded in June 2026, down from 75 in June 2025. Thirteen cases of *Plasmodium falciparum* malaria have occurred this year, compared to 206 in 2025. [\[Full article\]](#)



Measles

- **Bangladesh:** As of June 17, 2026, the measles outbreak has resulted in 666 child deaths since March 15, including 93 confirmed fatalities (Bhaskar Hindi, 2026). The Directorate General of Health Services reported 89,904 suspected cases and 10,773 confirmed infections, and 70,503 recoveries. Children under five years represent 79% of cases, with infants under nine months experiencing higher mortality. Declining vaccination coverage remains a key driver of transmission. - **Pakistan:** Sindh Province reported over 2,000 measles cases and 53 child deaths as of June 2026, contributing to 96 measles-related fatalities nationwide (Pro Pakistani, 2026). Authorities emphasize that measles is preventable through immunization and urge timely vaccination to reduce severe complications and further transmission. [[Full article](#)]
- The **United States (US):** Virginia has reported 121 measles cases statewide as of June 16, 2026, including 98 linked to an ongoing outbreak in Buckingham County (Fox 5 DC, 2026). Ten new cases were confirmed since June 11, including one local transmission. Health authorities emphasize measles' high transmissibility and recommend vaccination, surveillance, case investigation, contact tracing, and community outreach to limit further spread. Walla Walla County, Washington, reported seven measles cases as of mid-June 2026, the first since 2020, while statewide cases reached 45 compared with 11 in 2025 (Yakima Herald, 2026). Health authorities highlighted declining vaccination coverage as a contributing factor. Vaccination remains the key preventive measure, with two doses providing approximately 97% protection and helping protect vulnerable populations. [[Full article](#)]

Mpox

- **India:** Kerala reported a confirmed mpox case on June 18, 2026, in Thiruvananthapuram involving a resident of Kilimanoor who had recently returned from Saudi Arabia (Sathyam Online, 2026). The patient is under hospital observation, and close family contacts are being monitored. [[Full article](#)]

Typhoid

- **India:** Ahmedabad reported 88 typhoid cases from June 1-14, 2026 (Nav Gujarat Samay, 2026). Municipal health authorities tested 3,794 water samples during June, of which 30 were found unfit for consumption. This year, 151 of 39,789 samples tested have been deemed unsafe. Health authorities have intensified chlorine testing and routine water quality monitoring to safeguard drinking water and reduce the risk of waterborne disease transmission. [[Full article](#)]

Zika

- **Spain:** Navarre has reported one imported Zika case in a traveler returning from abroad (Diario de Navarra, 2026). Public Health advises returning travelers to prevent mosquito bites and recommends eliminating standing water around homes to reduce breeding sites and prevent potential autochthonous transmission.
