COVID-19 Highlights and Situation Overview

- WHO gave the disease the new name COVID-19. Under agreed guidelines between WHO, the World Organisation for Animal Health and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations find a name that did not refer to a geographical location, an animal, an individual or group of people, and which is also pronounceable and related to the disease.
- Last February 12, the WHO announced that the Coronavirus vaccine could be ready approximately 18 months
- WHO affirmed that the slowdown in the number of new infections should be taken cautiously as the situation can change in any direction. The WHO also stated that it is too early to predict the outbreaks' end
- Singapore and Malaysia will form a joint working group to prevent and control the coronavirus infection
- CDC announces that a diagnostic kit it developed does not work. This
 kit was made available to certified laboratories in the United States
 besides being shared with more than thirty countries. Due to a possible
 problem with one of the reagents some results could be made
 inconclusive (neither positive nor negative)
- A lockdown on Søn Lôi Commune (Vĩnh Phúc Province, Vietnam) was implemented by the authorities after five investigated cases were infected by a cluster. This would last until 3 March.
- The Japanese Health, Labour and Welfare Minister confirmed the country's first death in an individual with confirmed COVID-19 on February 13, 2020. This new case was an 80-year-old female, in Kanagawa prefecture near Tokyo, who developed symptoms on January 22 and was admitted to a local hospital on February 1. Although it was not clear if the virus had caused her death.
- Health Minister Katsunobu Kato said that it was only during the postmortem that doctors found that she tested positive for COVID-19.
- United Airlines announced on Wednesday that it would cancel all flights to and from China until April 24, a month later than originally planned, due to the rising cases of coronavirus in the country. The airline usually operates 12 flights a day from its hubs in the U.S. to several parts of China, including Beijing, Chengdu, Shanghai, and Hong Kong.

Cases and Deaths as of 14 February 2020

- As of February 14 (4PM, GMT+8), worldwide, there were **60,487** confirmed cases, including **1,371** deaths.
- In **China**, there were **59,982** confirmed cases with **1,369** deaths. Confirmed cases in China include confirmed cases in Hong Kong (53), Macao (10), and Taiwan (18)
- **Deaths outside mainland China** were reported in the Philippines (1), Hong Kong (1), and Japan (1).

Wuhan coronavirus: Timeline (continuation*)

- Belgium reported its first confirmed case of 2019-nCoV acute respiratory disease
- Wuhan now reported 10,117 cases in total, exceeding 10,000
- Japan confirmed 10 new cases from a quarantined cruise ship, the Diamond Princess, near Yokohama, bringing the total number up to 35 cases
- South Korea confirmed two more cases including a patient who returned from Singapore.
- Singapore confirmed four more cases, including a six-month-old Singaporean, bringing the total cases to 28
- Philippines confirmed its 3rd positive case, a 60-year-old woman from Wuhan, China
 - First confirmed case in Belgium
 - Additional cases in Wuhan, Hong Kong, Japan, South Korea, Singapore, Philippines

5 FEBRUARY 2020

- 72 States Parties were identified to be implementing travel restrictions
- Additional cases: Vietnam (1), Japan (6 from Diamond Princess cruise ship), Malaysia (1), Singapore (3), Hong Kong (10), Spain (1), UK (1), South Korea (3), Taiwan (1)
- First confirmed case have been reported in North Korea according to South Korea News Paper
 - Implementation of travel restrictions
- Additional cases in Vietnam, Japan, Malaysia, Singapore, Hong Kong, Spain, UK, South Korea, Taiwan
- First confirmed case in North Korea 7 FEBRUARY 2020

 Additional cases China, Hong Kong, Japan, Malaysia, Singapore, Taiwan, Vietnam, UK, and German

6 FEBRUARY 2020

- Hong Kong confirmed 3 more cases, bringing the total to 24
- Japan confirmed another 10 new cases from Cruise Ship Diamond Princess, quarantined in Yokohama, bringing the total to 45
- Malaysia confirmed 2 more cases, bringing the total to 14. One of the cases was locally transmitted, the first in Malaysia
- Singapore confirmed 2 more cases, bringing the total to 30
- Taiwan confirmed 3 more cases, bringing the total to 16
- Vietnam confirmed 2 more cases, bringing the total to 12
- The 3rd case of coronavirus was confirmed in the UK, with the patient having visited Singapore
- Germany confirmed its 13th case, and Italy confirmed its 3rd case, bringing the total number of confirmed cases in Europe to 31
