



## COVID-19: Highlights and Situation Overview

- Worldwide, there have been more than 8.4 million cases, and over 450,000 deaths attributed to COVID-19. Africa continues to experience an upward trend, and 8 countries account for at least 80% of the cases and deaths throughout the continent. The hot-spots include South Africa, Nigeria, Ghana, the Ivory Coast, and Cameroon. In addition, a cluster of cases in refugee camps in South Sudan is a matter of concern.
- World Health Organization (WHO) welcomes initial clinical trial results from the United Kingdom that show dexamethasone, a corticosteroid, can be lifesaving for patients who are critically ill with COVID-19. According to preliminary findings shared with WHO, for patients on ventilators, the treatment was shown to reduce mortality by about one third, and for patients who only require oxygen, mortality was cut by about one fifth. Also, according to WHO report, older people have been severely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Leaders from around the world have expressed their concern and called for response that address the needs and rights of older people (WHO Report 149).
- The investigation of a cluster of COVID-19 cases in Beijing associated with a wholesale market continues. As of 18 June, 10AM CEST, Chinese authorities have reported a total of 172 cases since 11 June, including 158 in Beijing, 10 linked cases in Hebei Province, 2 in Liaoning Province, 1 in Sichuan Province and 1 in Zhejiang Province. Three genetic sequences related to Xinfadi cluster have been uploaded to the GISAID database. WHO is closely monitoring the situation and is in close contact with national authorities in China.
- Chinese scientists have successfully isolated the coronavirus strain that caused the latest COVID-19 outbreak in Beijing, a significant progress that will greatly aid the epidemic control and prevention. According to the Chinese Centre for Disease Control and Prevention yesterday (June 18), the strain was isolated on June 15 from samples collected from the respiratory tracts of infected cases in Xinfadi, a major wholesale market for agricultural products in Beijing.
- Indonesia's Agency for the Assessment and Application of Technology (BPPT) and the national COVID-19 task force on research and technological innovation (TFRIC-19) have launched a mobile swab testing laboratory in an effort to increase the country's testing capacity. The mobile biosafety level 2 (BSL-2) laboratory, which was built inside a repurposed 20-foot container, was first used for swab testing in Ridwan Meuraksa hospital in East Jakarta on June 16 and is capable of testing 120 samples in 12 hours. Meanwhile, the Palembang administration officially lifted the large-scale social restrictions (PSBB) in Palembang, South Sumatra since June 16. Palembang's status has been lowered to orange zone from red zone. So, the task force decided to revoke the restriction, but we will still maintain the health protocols. The Health Ministry announced 1,331 new confirmed COVID-19 cases on June 18, bringing the total number of infections nationwide to 42,762, now the highest among ASEAN countries.
- A media report today (June 19) stated Laos has received praise from representatives of international health organizations for its containment of the COVID-19. Laos' Prime Minister an initial victory over COVID-19 following the discharge of all 19 confirmed cases from hospital on 10 June, with no new cases for 59 days. He said at a press conference that Laos had "gained an important victory in the first campaign against this vicious enemy," adding that it was a significant advance in the battle against COVID-19.

- Prime Minister Thongloun Sisoulith declared an initial victory over Covid-19 following the discharge of all 19 confirmed cases from hospital on 10 June, with no new cases for 59 days.
- Singapore's Ministry of Health (MOH) said on Thursday (June 18), those aged 45 and above who are diagnosed with acute respiratory infection (ARI) will be tested for COVID-19 starting next week. This is part of the ministry's plan to expand its testing strategy as the economy reopens, with the aim of eventually testing all patients who are diagnosed with acute respiratory infection. The ministry mentioned that the risk of severe COVID-19 infection increases from age 45 adding that this testing strategy will progressively be extended to include more groups. In addition, The Ministry of Manpower (MOM) said in a press release on Thursday (June 18) that to prevent a wave of new COVID-19 infections, migrant workers should continue staying within their dormitories on their rest days as Singapore moves into Phase 2 of its reopening. However, workers will still be able to access communal facilities within the dormitories with safe distancing measures in place.
- Vietnam's Ministry of Foreign Affairs stated on June 18 that Vietnam is holding talks aimed at easing the entry of citizens from China, South Korea and Japan into the country after restrictions on foreign visitors amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **Travel Advisories** (new update/s)

- Brunei: According to the Minister of Health, foreign workers in the oil and gas industry who are required to enter Brunei Darussalam must carry out their swab test both in their country and upon arriving in Brunei Darussalam
- Malaysia: Interstate travel resumed in Malaysia on June 17 in a further easing of coronavirus restrictions to revive an economy hard hit by the pandemic. A senior officer also mentioned on Wednesday that travel agreements may be sought with "green bubble" countries such as Singapore, Brunei and Thailand, where infection rates are manageable. Malaysia Airlines is introducing enhanced economy class flexible fare options across its entire network for all passengers to enjoy, offering unparalleled safety, security, flexibility and a complete hassle-free, premium experience based on the needs of each customer. In a statement today (June 19), Malaysia Airlines said the options, which were previously limited to domestic, Asean and South Asian destinations, will now see passengers have access to three unique fare options (Lite, Basic and Flex) for all destinations except Malaysia to Japan to Malaysia, Jeddah and Madinah, beginning June 22, 2020.
- Thailand: Thailand eases up on social distancing requirements for domestic travel. The Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand says carriers can now sell every seat on a flight. The requirement for Thailand's airlines to leave every second seat empty, as part of the conditions under which domestic services could resume, is being done away with. However, the CAAT says airlines must upgrade their in-flight ventilation, replacing high efficiency particulate air filters regularly. In addition, the wearing of face masks for all passengers and crew for the duration of the flight remains mandatory. In a further easing of the conditions governing domestic travel, Thailand's Transport Minister says from

July 31, members of the same family may sit together on Bangkok's electric train network

- China: China imposed travel restrictions on nearly half a million people near its capital on Thursday (June 18) to contain a fresh coronavirus outbreak as deaths surged in other parts of the world. China was back in containment mode after previously lifting huge lockdowns that had confined tens of millions to their homes.
- Japan: Japan lifted all coronavirus-related curbs on domestic travel today (June 19). Japan's two big airlines, ANA and Japan Airlines, said they are restarting some domestic flights as demand picks up, but both say flight schedules by July will still only be half of what they had planned before the coronavirus pandemic.

- As of June 19 (2PM, GMT+8), worldwide, there were **8,416,524** confirmed cases, including **452,489** deaths. Globally, Case Fatality Ratio (CFR)\* is **5.38**
- In **China**, there were **84,824** confirmed cases with **4,645** deaths, including deaths in Hong Kong (4) and Taiwan (7). Confirmed cases in China include confirmed cases in Hong Kong (1,125), Macau (45), and Taiwan (445).


