



## COVID-19: Highlights and Situation Overview

- Worldwide, there have been over 122.5 million cases and more than 2.7 million deaths attributed to COVID-19.
- The Japanese government's advisory panel on coronavirus measures approved on Thursday (March 18) its plan to let the state of emergency expire in the Tokyo area as scheduled on March 21. While other parts of the country lifted the emergency status at the end of February, Tokyo, Kanagawa, Chiba and Saitama prefectures extended it, with officials saying they wanted to see a continued decline in infections and hospitalizations. Upon lifting of the state of emergency, the four prefectures will ask restaurants to close by 9pm, at least until the end of March, to reduce the chance of a resurgence in infections.

### Vaccine Update

- According to the country's Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on Friday (March 19), the Philippines has approved Russia's Sputnik V COVID-19 vaccine for emergency use. The vaccine, developed by Russia's Gamaleya Institute, is the fourth to get emergency use authorization in the Philippines. The authority said that the known and potential benefits of the Gamaleya Sputnik V vaccine outweigh the known and potential risks of said vaccine. He added that the interim data showed the two-dose Sputnik V vaccine had an efficacy of 91.6% in age groups 18 and older. The government plans to roll out 140.5 million vaccines by December 2021, to inoculate 70 million adults and achieve herd immunity for a safer reopening of the country's economy. The country has already launched its vaccination programme on March 1 and has received delivery of 1.125 million doses of the Sinovac and AstraZeneca vaccines.
- Singapore's Ministry of Trade and Industry (MTI) said on Thursday (Mar 18) that Malaysian cargo drivers who have received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine in Singapore will receive an immunization certificate and be exempted from daily on-arrival tests 14 days after the second dose. MTI said cargo drivers who are not vaccinated will still be allowed to enter Singapore, but they will be subjected to prevailing border health measures such as COVID-19 tests on arrival. Additionally, the ministry said that all cargo drivers and accompanying personnel, regardless of vaccination status entering Singapore, will still be required to adhere to existing safety measures.

### Travel Advisories (new update/s)

- Thailand: According to the Department of Aviation (DOA), Krabi airport is planning to double its passenger handling capacity with a third terminal expected to open by October. The move is planned alongside the reopening of Thailand to international tourists. The terminal is expected to hold around 3,000 people per hour, doubling its current holding power of 1,500 people. The DOA says domestic flights are currently operating at airports in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, Udon Thani, Ubon Ratchathani, Surat Thani, Khon Kaen, Krabi, Trang, Phitsanulok, Sakon Nakhon, Lampang, Nan Nakhon, Nakhon Phanom, Loei, Buri Ram and Mae Sot. Meanwhile, tourism officials are working on what they're calling the "sandbox," a new pilot programme to re-open Phuket and other destinations to foreign visitors. The sandbox is like the "travel bubble" idea and would allow quarantine-free travel to certain areas.
- Philippines: The Philippines' National Task Force against COVID-19 said on March 19 that the government has revised its travel restrictions for inbound passengers and allowed the entry of all Filipino citizens. All Filipino citizens, whether a returning Overseas Filipino or overseas Filipino worker shall be allowed to return to the Philippines. Meanwhile, effective March 22, the entry of foreign nationals shall be temporarily suspended except for: a) diplomats and members of international organizations; b) foreign nationals involved in medical

repatriation that was duly endorsed by the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), Office of the Undersecretary for Migrant Workers Affairs and Overseas Workers Welfare Administration, provided that they have a valid visa at the time of entry; c) foreign seafarers under the "Green Lanes" program; d) foreign spouses and children of Filipino citizens; and e) emergency, humanitarian and other analogous cases approved by the chairperson of the NTF COVID-19

### Cases and Deaths as of 19 March 2021

- As of 19 March 2021 (2PM, GMT+8), worldwide, there were **122,530,111** confirmed cases, including **2,702,870** deaths. Globally, Case Fatality Rate (CFR) is **2.2**.
- In **China**, there were **102,469** confirmed cases with **4,849** deaths, including deaths in Hong Kong (203) and Taiwan (10). Confirmed cases in China include confirmed cases in Hong Kong (11,351), Macau (48), and Taiwan (998).
- **2,647,524 confirmed cases** of COVID-19 have been reported in the ASEAN region with a total of **56,614 deaths**, with a CFR of **2.1**.

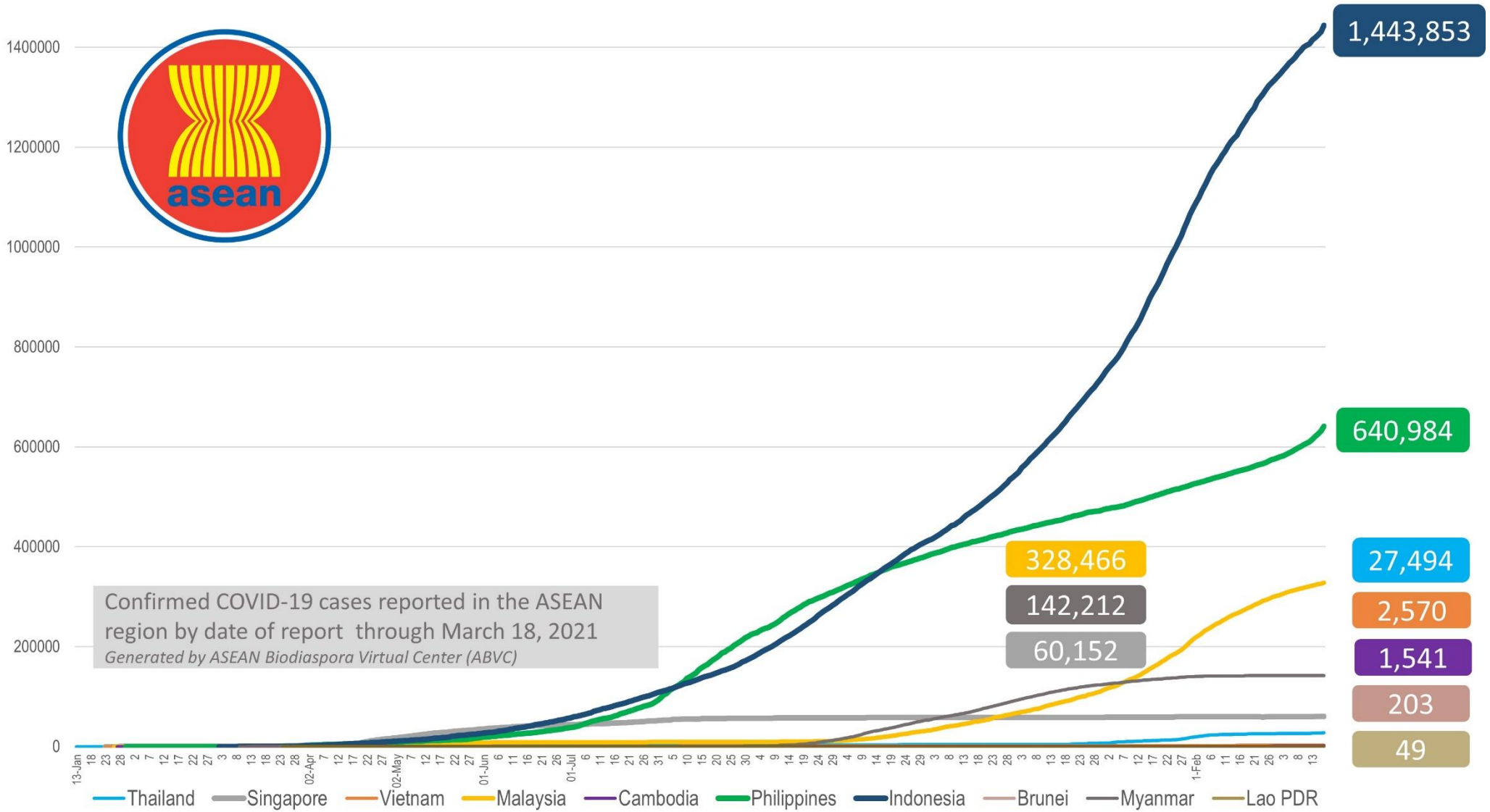
