COVID-19 Highlights and Situation Overview

- The WHO-China joint mission concluded on 24 February. The team has made a range of findings about the transmissibility of the virus, the severity of disease and the impact of the measures taken. Some of the information/findings from this mission are:
 - the epidemic peaked and plateaued were between the 23rd of January and the 2nd of February, and has been declining steadily since then.
 - o there has been no significant change in the DNA of the virus.
 - o fatality rate is between 2% and 4% in Wuhan, and 0.7% outside Wuhan.
 - people with mild disease, recovery time is about two weeks, while people with severe or critical disease recover within three to six weeks.
 - It was estimated that the measures taken in China have averted a significant number of cases.
- A joint WHO and European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) mission arrived in Italy on 24 February to support Italian authorities on the COVID-19 situation
- According to ECDC, all previously reported cases in the EU/EEA and UK have clearly established epidemiological links; contact tracing measures have been in place to contain further spread. Extraordinary public health measures have been implemented in northern Italy and strong efforts are being made to identify, isolate and test contacts in order to contain the outbreak. The probability of further transmission in the EU/EEA and the UK is considered to be low, but cannot be excluded because a high level of uncertainties with several unpredictable factors and a situation that is still evolving.

New country with COVID-19 case/s

- KUWAIT (8 cases)
 - The first individual is a 53-year-old Kuwaiti citizen, the second is a 61-year-old Saudi Arabian citizen, and the third is a 21year-old with undisclosed nationality. All individuals have been placed under isolation and are in stable condition.
 - All of these cases are in returning travellers from Iran.

BAHRAIN (8 cases)

- All cases have been in returning travellers from Iran
- The new 5 cases were identified through screening upon their arrival from Iran through Dubai into the Bahrain International Airport. Local health authorities have quarantined close contacts and are continuing contact tracing.

IRAQ (5 cases)

• All cases to date have a recent travel history to Iran. The newly confirmed cases are members of an Iraqi family who recently returned to Kirkuk province in northern Iraq from Iran. The first case in Iraq, which was reported on Feb 24, was an Iranian student who recently returned from Iran to the holy city of Najaf, located south of Baghdad.

OMAN (2 cases)

Health authorities confirmed the first two cases of COVID-19 in Oman as of February 24, 2020. Although there are limited details available, the report indicates that the individuals are Omani citizens who had recently travelled to Iran. They are currently in stable condition and have been placed under isolation.

AFGHANISTAN (1 case)

 the individual had a recent travel history to the city of Qom in Iran. Iran has reported more than 60 cases as of February 24, with many located in Qom or linked to Qom through travel.

CROATIA (1 case)

• the report indicates that the male individual is in Zagreb, Croatia's largest city and capital and that he had travelled to Milan from February 19 to 21. The individual is currently isolated at a medical center and close contacts have been placed under quarantine.

AUSTRIA (2 cases)

 the report indicates that both individuals are Italians who live in Innsbruck, Tyrol (Tirol) in Austria. Tyrol is near the border with northern Italy where there is currently a COVID-19 outbreak

ALGERIA (1 case)

 the affected individual is an Italian citizen who arrived in Algeria on February 17 and is under isolation

SWITZERLAND (1 case)

• the affected individual is a 70-year-old man from Ticino, near the northern Italian border where there is currently an outbreak of COVID-19. This individual had visited Milan on February 15 and developed symptoms on February 17. He is under isolation at a local hospital and close contacts will be quarantined and tested.

Increasing Cluster Cases in South Korea

- 460 are epidemiologically linked to the Shincheonji religious group in the city of Daegu including 6 deaths
- o The majority of the cases are concentrated on the following locations within the country: the southern city of Daegu (543)

cases), North Gyeongsang province (248 cases) and the port city of Busan (43 cases)

Increasing Cluster Cases in Italy

- o As of 25 Feb 2020, there are 206 confirmed cases in Lombardy (31 new), 38 in Veneto (11 new), 21 in Emilia-Romagna (5 new), 3 in Piemonte (Piedmont) region, 3 in Rome and a new case was recorded in Sicilia. There are 11 cases (6 new) with limited details as to their locations. Contact tracing to determine the initial source(s) of infection(s) and epidemiological links for non-travel associated cases is still underway.
- o According to ECDC, the current event in Italy indicates that local transmission may have resulted in several clusters for which an epidemiological link to areas where ongoing transmission is presumed, was not apparent. The accumulated evidence from clusters reported in the EU/EEA and the UK indicates that once imported, the virus causing COVID-19 can transmit rapidly. This may emanate from cases with mild symptoms that do not provoke healthcare-seeking behaviour. The increases in cases and the number of countries outside China reporting those cases increases the potential routes of importation of the infection into the EU/EEA and the UK.
- Italian authorities have implemented draconian measures to try to halt the coronavirus outbreak in the north of the country, including imposing fines on anyone caught entering or leaving outbreak areas.
- Singapore will ban visitors arriving from Cheongdo and Daegu in South Korea from 26 February 2020, after cases increased rapidly in these two cities. Singapore citizens, permanent residents and long-term pass holders returning from Cheongdo and Daegu within the last 14 days will be issued a Stay-Home Notice (SHN) for 14 days.
- Hong Kong bans travellers arriving from South Korea starting from 25
 February at 6am. This comes after the number of cases in South Korea
 have increased drastically
- Iraq banned travellers from China, Iran, Thailand, South Korea, Japan, Italy and Singapore from entering the country as of 25 February 2020

Cases and Deaths as of 26 February 2020

- As of February 26 (2PM, GMT+8), worldwide, there were **80,463** confirmed cases, including **2,712** deaths.
- In **China**, there were **77,905** confirmed cases with **2,669** deaths (including deaths in Hong Kong and Taiwan). Confirmed cases in China include confirmed cases in Hong Kong (79), Macau (10), and Taiwan (31)

- **Deaths outside mainland China** were reported in the Philippines (1), Hong Kong (2), Taiwan (1), Japan (3), France (1), Iran (8), South Korea (5), and Italy (2).
