COVID-19: Highlights and Situation Overview

- The WHO Director-General highlighted in his media briefing yesterday that the chronic global shortage of personal protective equipment (PPE) is one of the most urgent threats to our collective ability to save lives. To date, WHO has shipped almost 2 million individual items of PPE to 74 countries and is preparing to send a similar amount to a further 60 countries.
- On March 28, WHO published the first edition of the practical manual to set up and manage a severe acute respiratory infection (SARI) treatment centre and a SARI screening facility in health-care facilities. The document has been developed to meet the operational needs emerging with the COVID-19 pandemic.
- On March 28 and 29, Brunei assisted Malaysia with the repatriation of 84 Malaysians who were stranded in Cairo. Malaysia on the other hand assisted Brunei with the repatriation of 134 Bruneians who were stranded in Kuala Lumpur. The special and strong *muhibah* bilateral ties has made this collaboration possible. The first flight arrived on Saturday morning carrying 236 students, while the second flight arrived on Sunday morning carrying 131 Bruneian students as well as 84 Malaysians stranded in Egypt. The Malaysian contingent from Cairo flew back to Kuala Lumpur on March 29, accompanied by another 25 Malaysian nationals who were stranded in Brunei.
- The Indonesian capital of Jakarta has extended its state of emergency as the number of Covid-19 cases has surged across the country. Initially, the state of emergency status was first imposed on March 20 and was expected to end on April 5. On March 29, Jakarta Governor Anies Baswedan announced that the state of emergency will have a two-week extension until April 19.
- A team of Chinese medical experts, along with medical materials, arrived in Lao capital Vientiane by a chartered plane on March 29 morning to assist Laos fight the COVID-19 pandemic. The Chinese medical team include experts in various fields such as infection prevention and control, intensive care, epidemics, and laboratory testing.
- On March 29, Government Spokesperson and Minister to the Prime Minister's Office Chalern Yapaoher headed a press conference to outline the details of the Prime Minister's Order regarding the country's new and upgraded COVID-19 regulations. This order include: a) Public servants (state workers) are to work from home April 1-11, and will be on holiday leave to observe the Lao New Year holiday until April 19, except for military and police officers, firefighters, water and electrical (utilities) company staff, media personnel, doctors and nurses, volunteers, and other individuals that have been authorized to remain at work to combat the spread of the disease; b) prohibition for all people (nationals, expatriates, stateless individuals) to leave their homes or domiciles except for buying necessities; c) prohibition for people to travel to other provinces or areas where there are known infected cases or at-risk areas; d) prohibited to either hoard or to increase the price of essential goods that are necessary for virus prevention (i.e. mask, alcohol, etc.); d) prohibition to spread news and information that are false, misleading, and engendering societal panic; e) prohibited to organize gatherings of any sort of more than 10 people; f) all entertainment venues must remain closed. The order will take effect starting Monday, Mar 30 until April 19, or until further notice.
- Malaysia's Movement Control Order (MCO) period will be extended from March 31 to April 14 as the local death toll from the virus rises

- Singapore government donated 40,000 COVID-19 diagnostic tests and two ventilators to the Philippines. These additional test kits will supplement Singapore's earlier donation to allow more people to have an early diagnosis, while the ventilators will be crucial for the survival of severe COVID-19 cases.
- **Travel Advisories (new updates)**
 - Cambodia: The Cambodian government will impose travel restrictions in order to reduce and contain the transmission of the coronavirus, effective March 31, 2020 (12AM). In a statement last March 27, the government said it would suspend the visa exemption policy and issuance of tourist visas, e-visas and visas on arrival to all foreigners for one month. Any foreigner wishing to travel to Cambodia must obtain a prior visa from Cambodian missions abroad, the statement said, adding that an individual must provide a medical certificate, issued by competent health authorities of their country no more than 72 hours prior to the date of travel, certifying that they have not tested positive for the COVID-19. In addition, they must provide proof of minimum medical coverage during their intended stay in Cambodia in the amount not less than US\$50,000. The Cambodian requirements for a medical certificate and insurance do not apply to any foreigner holding a diplomatic visa (Visa A) or official visa (Visa B) for the country.
 - Indonesia: Indonesia's easternmost province of Papua has closed its airports, sea ports and land borders for 14 days to prevent the spread of the virus. Meanwhile, airline company AirAsia Indonesia plans to suspend flights across the country, commencing on Wednesday (April 1), and will end on April 21 for domestic flights and May 17 for international flights.
 - Laos: Prime Minister's Order stated that international and interprovincial and traditional borders must remain closed to all people from Mar 30 until April 19. Only transport vehicles that have explicit authorization to transport commercial goods may cross these borders. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs must handle the affairs of foreign nationals wishing to return to their home countries.
 - Myanmar: Myanmar will ban all international passenger flights into its airports starting today (March 30) as part of the country's efforts to prevent the spread of coronavirus pandemic. Civil aviation authority stated that no international commercial passenger flights will be allowed to land in Myanmar until April 31. The Department of Civil Aviation said in a statement that it also suspends all landing permissions it previously granted. The measure will not apply to relief, cargo, medical evacuation flights as well as specially-approved flights. It will also temporarily suspend entry visas beginning March 29 except to diplomats, UN officials and crews of ships and aircraft operating to and from Myanmar.
 - Thailand: All bridges onto and off the Phuket island will be closed to all traffic except emergency service vehicles and trucks delivering goods, and all ports and piers will be closed to general traffic starting March 30. The move comes in the latest order by Phuket Governor Phakaphong Tavipatana to help prevent the spread of the COVID-19 coronavirus. The order, dated Mar 29, was issued publicly at 7PM. In this order, no vehicles will be permitted across the bridges except rescue services and

ambulances and those engaged in delivering the gas and petrol construction materials, medical equipment and supplies, parcel and mail delivery, and all forms of printed media. All ports and piers on the island also will be closed to all passenger boats arriving or departing. The closure of the bridges and piers will remain in effect until April 30, or later if needed.

- Singapore: Singapore has further tightened restrictions on the entry of foreigners in the country. According to the Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA), Ministry of Education (MOE) and Ministry of Manpower (MOM), all long-term pass holders will be required of an entry approval before entering or returning to Singapore starting March 29. Long-term pass holders include those who hold long-term visit passes, student passes, as well as those who have been granted in-principle approval for a long-term pass.
- Vietnam: The Vietnamese government has ordered a halt on inbound flights, cut domestic flights, stopped public gatherings and temporarily shut down non-essential services until April 15 at the earliest.
- China: All airports in Hubei resumed some domestic flights on March 29, with the exception of Wuhan, which will open to domestic flights on April 8. Flights from Hubei to Beijing remain suspended.
- Japan: The country will expand its entry ban to include people travelling from the US, China, South Korea and most of Europe starting March 28 to April 30. The measure will apply to foreign nationals who have been to any of the listed regions within 14 days of arriving in Japan. All Japanese returnees and foreigners who have traveled outside the banned areas will be asked to self-quarantine for 14 days and watch for symptoms of COVID-19.
- South Korea: Starting April 1, all travelers entering South Korea will be subjected to two weeks of mandatory quarantine. The measure will also include short-term foreign visitors in order to practically block the entry for unimportant purposes, such as tourism. Those who don't have an address in the country will be quarantined in a government-provided facility for two weeks at their own expense.

Cases and Deaths as of 30 March 2020

- As of March 30 (2PM, GMT+8), worldwide, there were **703,437** confirmed cases, including **35,703** deaths.
- In **China**, there were **82,419** confirmed cases with **3,306** deaths, including deaths in Hong Kong (4) and Taiwan (2). Confirmed cases in China include confirmed cases in Hong Kong (641), Macau (37), and Taiwan (298).
- **621,018 confirmed cases** of COVID-19 have been reported in **198 countries/states** (other than China, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Macau):

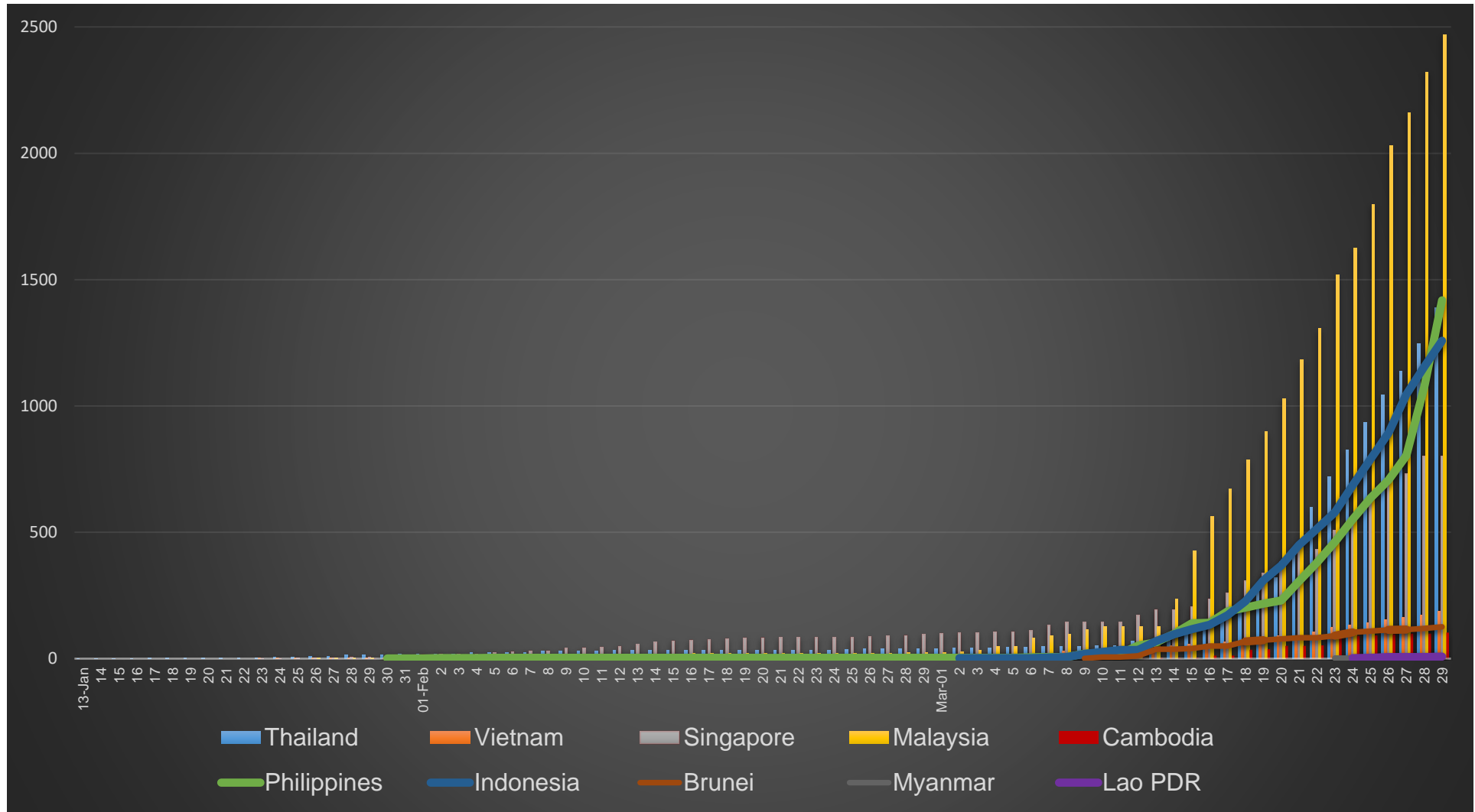
