COVID-19: Highlights and Situation Overview

Global Updates

- Worldwide, over 695 million cases and over 6 million deaths have been attributed to COVID-19.
- United States: COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations in the US have surged, with 15,067 new cases and 17.6% increase in deaths in the most recent week, according to the CDC (Jingjing, 2023). Los Angeles County has seen cases double in the last month, with nursing homes particularly affected. The EG.5 variant, the dominant strain, is drawing concerns from health officials and experts. School districts have no longer had comprehensive surveillance data, and decisions on mitigation measures are largely up to school district leaders, local health authorities, and community consultation. Updated vaccines are expected to become available by the end of September. Experts recommend people, especially vulnerable groups, get vaccinated against all three viruses simultaneously to better protect themselves. [Full article]
- Israel: The Israeli Ministry of Health reported a moderate increase in coronavirus hospitalization due to variant spread. Hospitals are instructed to perform PCR tests on inpatients within three weeks (Eeranlahav, 2023). The ministry is monitoring morbidity trends and is preparing vaccines for winter. Patients with symptoms are advised to stay quarantined for five days. [Full article]

Regional Updates

• **Thailand:** Chon Buri reported 544 confirmed cases of COVID-19, 60 of which were from Laming (Fronde, 2023). Public Health Officer, Kitti Bunrattanate encouraged the public to get vaccinated against COVID-19 and influenza to control the spread of these diseases. [Full article]

- As of 07 September 2023 (5PM, GMT+7), worldwide, there were **695,033,548** confirmed cases, including **6,913,048** deaths. Globally, Case Fatality Rate (CFR) was **1.0%**.
- 36,366,470 total confirmed cases of COVID-19 have been reported in the ASEAN Region.
- The Case Fatality Rate in the **ASEAN** Region was 1.01%.

Mpox: Highlights and Situation Overview

- From 01 January to 04 September 2023, there were **5,637** confirmed cases worldwide in 2023, including **83** deaths. Globally, the Case Fatality Rate (CFR) was **1.47%.**
- **315 confirmed cases** including **1 death** in the ASEAN region in 2023, with a CFR of **0.32%**.
- **5,322 confirmed cases** of mpox have been reported in other **5 regions** in 2023 (other than the ASEAN region):

Regional Updates

• **Thailand** has seen a significant increase in Monkeypox cases, with a total of 316 cases reported in a single month (Rose, 2023). The majority of the cases are men who have sexual intercourse with other men, accounting for 85.8% of the total. 45.3% of these patients are infected with HIV. The majority of the patients are Thai nationals, with 198 residing in Bangkok. The outbreak has been ongoing for four months, with the World Health Organization providing support in the form of Tecovirimat, a drug used to treat severe confirmed cases. The outbreak initially affected the working-age male population, but a significant increase in teenagers has been reported. [Full article]
