
# COVID-19 Situational Report in the ASEAN+3 Region

## **COVID-19: Highlights and Situation Overview**

#### Global Update

- Worldwide, there have been over 570 million cases and over 6 million deaths attributed to COVID-19.
- According to the World Health Organization's (WHO's) Weekly Epidemiological Update, the number of weekly cases for the week of July 11–17, 2022, stayed constant after climbing over the previous five weeks, with slightly under 6.3 million new cases<sup>1</sup>. With 11,000 fatalities reported, the number of new weekly deaths was comparable to the amount recorded the week before<sup>1</sup>. [Full Report]

### **Regional Update**

- Cambodia: Following nearly two months of COVID-free living, Cambodia today once more reported new COVID cases<sup>2</sup>. The discovery of the first COVID-19 case linked to a brand-new antibody-avoiding subvariant, BA.2.75, in Thailand has sparked alarm today<sup>2</sup>. The COVID-19 tale has recently taken a turn for the worse, putting Cambodia on high alert as a result of the frequent crossings of migrant Cambodian laborers from Thailand into Cambodia<sup>2</sup>. - Philippines: To facilitate pandemic response, the National Task Force (NTF) Against COVID-19 has announced the transfer of its responsibilities to the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC)<sup>4</sup>. Under the direction of the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases, the NTF was founded under the administration of former president Rodrigo Duterte to carry out the National Action Plan Against COVID-19 (IATF-EID)<sup>4</sup>. Mark Timbal, a spokesman for the NDRRMC, said on Thursday that since managing pandemic management programs is part of the organization's "regular activities," it won't require additional funding<sup>4</sup>. He stated that they will aid the Department of Health's initiatives to get booster shots to more people who have already been immunized<sup>4</sup>.
- **South Korea:** According to local media, South Korea reported over 70,000 new COVID-19 infections on July 21—for the third day in a row—as a highly infectious omicron subvariant spread quickly throughout the country<sup>7</sup>. The increase, which began in late June, was linked by the Korea Disease Control and Prevention Agency to the omicron subvariant BA.5<sup>7</sup>. [Full Article]
- **Japan:** On Thursday, the number of new coronavirus cases in the capital of Japan surpassed 30,000 for the first time since the epidemic started, setting a milestone that prompted officials to urge further monitoring<sup>8</sup>. A previous peak in February was considerably exceeded by Tokyo's 31,878 new infections, and many other locations also recorded highs<sup>8</sup>. A record number of 186,229 new illnesses were reported nationwide on Thursday<sup>8</sup>. Officials said hospitals were beginning to feel the burden from growing numbers despite few catastrophic illnesses and fatalities<sup>8</sup>. [Full Article]
- China: According to a Chinese health authority official, the COVID-19 situation has been oscillating at a low level throughout China since the beginning of July, with resurgences recorded in many locations within a few areas? According to He Qinghua, a representative of the National Health Commission's disease control department, the outbreak has recently hit 78 cities across 21 provincial-level areas? Overall, He said that resurgences in various areas had been effectively controlled in a short amount of time, and the impact of the epidemic was minimal? He also noted that the effectiveness and capacity of local epidemic response had been significantly enhanced? [Full Article]

#### Vaccine Update

- Indonesia: An increase in the third or booster COVID-19 vaccine coverage has been requested by Indonesia's Health Minister Budi Gunadi Sadikin due to an increase in illnesses there<sup>3</sup>. On July 21, when visiting numerous schools in the Bogor area of West Java, he stated that those who have not had the booster injection may be 20 times more likely to contract COVID-19<sup>3</sup>. Only around 50 million Indonesians, or about 25% of the intended 208.26 million residents, have so far gotten the booster dosage, he said<sup>3</sup>. [Full Article]
- **Philippines**: Only 51.05% of the eligible population in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) has received a COVID-19 vaccination, according to data released on July 21 by the Department of Health (DOH)<sup>5</sup>. This was based on information from the National Vaccination Operations Center (NCOV), which revealed that as of July 21, only 1,584,124 people in BARMM had received vaccinations<sup>5</sup>. - **Singapore:** A real-world study that was published yesterday in the New England Journal of Medicine shows that two doses of the Pfizer/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine were 82.7% effective in preventing hospitalization during the Omicron variant surge in Singapore, 63.5% effective in preventing test-confirmed cases, and 36.8% effective in preventing all SARS-CoV-2 infections in 5- to 11-year-old children (NEJM)<sup>6</sup>. - As of 22 July 2022 (2PM, GMT+8), worldwide, there were **570,561,506** confirmed cases, including **6,399,983** deaths. Globally, Case Fatality Rate (CFR) was **1.2%**.
- 67,832,004 confirmed cases of COVID-19 have been reported in the ASEAN +3 countries including 32,661,621 cases in the ASEAN region and 35,170,383 cases in the PLUS THREE countries.
- The Case Fatality Rate in the ASEAN +3 region is range between 0.1 to 3.2%




# COVID-19 BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron Surge in ASEAN+3 Region:

As of July 21, 2022




# **COVID-19 Epi curve among ASEAN Countries:**


