COVID-19: Highlights and Situation Overview

Global Update

- Worldwide, there have been over 195 million cases and over 4 million deaths attributed to COVID-19.
- According to the World Health Organization, between July 12-18, all regions reported an increase in new cases except for the Americas and Africa. In addition, reported deaths in South-East Asia and the Western Pacific Regions increased by 12% and 10%, respectively, as compared to the previous week. Based on the BlueDot COVID-19 Data Suite, as of July 22, the top five countries with the highest seven-day rolling average number of daily new cases are the United Kingdom, United States, Indonesia, India, and Brazil. The top five countries with the highest seven-day rolling average number of daily new cases per million population are the British Virgin Islands, Jersey, Isle of Man, Fiji, and Gibraltar. As of July 22, Europe is the continent with the largest proportion of countries (22%, or 11 out of 51) with a high incidence rate (>350) and a stable or increasing trend in daily new cases over the last seven days. In addition, Europe also has the highest proportion of countries (45%, 23 out of 51) with a low (<=140) to moderate (140.1 - 350) incidence rate and with an increasing trend in new cases over the last seven days. The continent of North and Central America has the largest proportion of countries reporting a moderate incidence rate (140.1 - 350) with a stable trend in new cases over the past seven days (12%, five out of 41). South America is the continent with the highest proportion of countries reporting a moderate (140.1 - 350) to high (>350) incidence rate, with a decreasing trend in new cases over the past seven days (36%, five out of 14). Lastly, Africa is the continent with the highest proportion of countries reporting a low incidence rate (<= 140) with a stable or decreasing trend in new cases over the past seven days (66%, 37 out of 56).

Regional Update

- Indonesian President said on Sunday (July 25) that the current restrictions put in place to curb COVID-19 will continue until August 2, but several adjustments related to community activities and mobility will be made. Under the PPKM (community-level public activity restrictions enforcement) Level 4, people's movements are restricted according to the sectors they work in, and only employees in critical sectors such as energy and health are allowed to go back to the workplace. PPKM Emergency, which was subsequently renamed to PPKM Level 4, has been imposed from July 3 to July 25 in Java and Bali as Indonesia is battling a surge in COVID-19 cases.
- Philippines' Department of Health said today (July 26) that the country's capital, Metro Manila, and five other regions in the country are seeing a reversal of COVID-19 case trend, recording positive growth rates of coronavirus cases in the last two weeks. According to the health official, the country saw a one-percent increase in COVID-19 cases in the recent two weeks from July 11 to 24, as compared to the cases from June 27 to July 10.
- Thailand on Sunday (July 25) reported 15,335 COVID-19 cases, a daily record, bringing the country's COVID-19 cumulative cases to 497,302. Bangkok on July 23 shut parks and the few remaining public places available to residents. The near-total restriction on movements in the capital came as the prime minister demanded officials find ways to get the sick into hospitals after people with COVID-19 were found dead on the streets of Bangkok.
- Vietnam's Hanoi will impose a 15-day social distancing campaign starting July 24 as part of efforts to curb the spread of COVID-19.

The capital city's chairman said that the citywide order is being issued under Directive 16, which comprises the country's most stringent social distancing regulations, requiring residents to stay at home and only go out for basic necessities such as buying food or medicines or to work at factories or businesses that are allowed to open. People must keep a distance of at least two meters. No more than two people can gather at public places apart from workplaces, schools or hospitals. Daily online medical declaration is required and if anyone has potential symptoms like fever and cough, they must inform local authorities of their condition immediately. Also starting today (July 26), But beginning Monday, an additional, strict stay-at-home order will be in effect from 6 pm to 6 am local time

Vaccine Update

- As of July 22, a total of 10 countries accounted for 75% of all vaccinations administered globally. The top five countries/territories with the highest number of cumulative people vaccinated with at least one dose per 100,000 population are Gibraltar (116,680), Malta (88,110), Palau (80,960), Iceland (78,290), and the United Arab Emirates (77,700).
- Vietnam receives 3,000,060 doses of Moderna vaccine donated through the COVAX Facility by the United States Government, of which, 1,499,960 arrived in Ho Chi Minh City on July 24 and 1,500,100 doses arrived in Hanoi on July 25. This is the second batch of Moderna vaccine to arrive in the country this month, bringing the total donation from the United States Government to Vietnam to more than five million doses. To date, Vietnam has received 7,493,300 doses of COVID-19 vaccines in four shipments through the COVAX Facility including 5,000,100 doses of Moderna vaccine from the US Government and 2,493,200 doses of AstraZeneca.
- Malaysia's health ministry said that the country administered 399,135 doses of a COVID-19 vaccine on Sunday (July 25). So far, 11.7 million people or 36.1% of the population had received a single dose of a vaccine while 5.5 million people or 16.9% of the population had received both doses of vaccine.

Travel Advisories (new update/s)

- Vietnam: Starting July 24, the majority of public transportation in Ho Chi Minh will be shut down and there will be no travel to other localities.

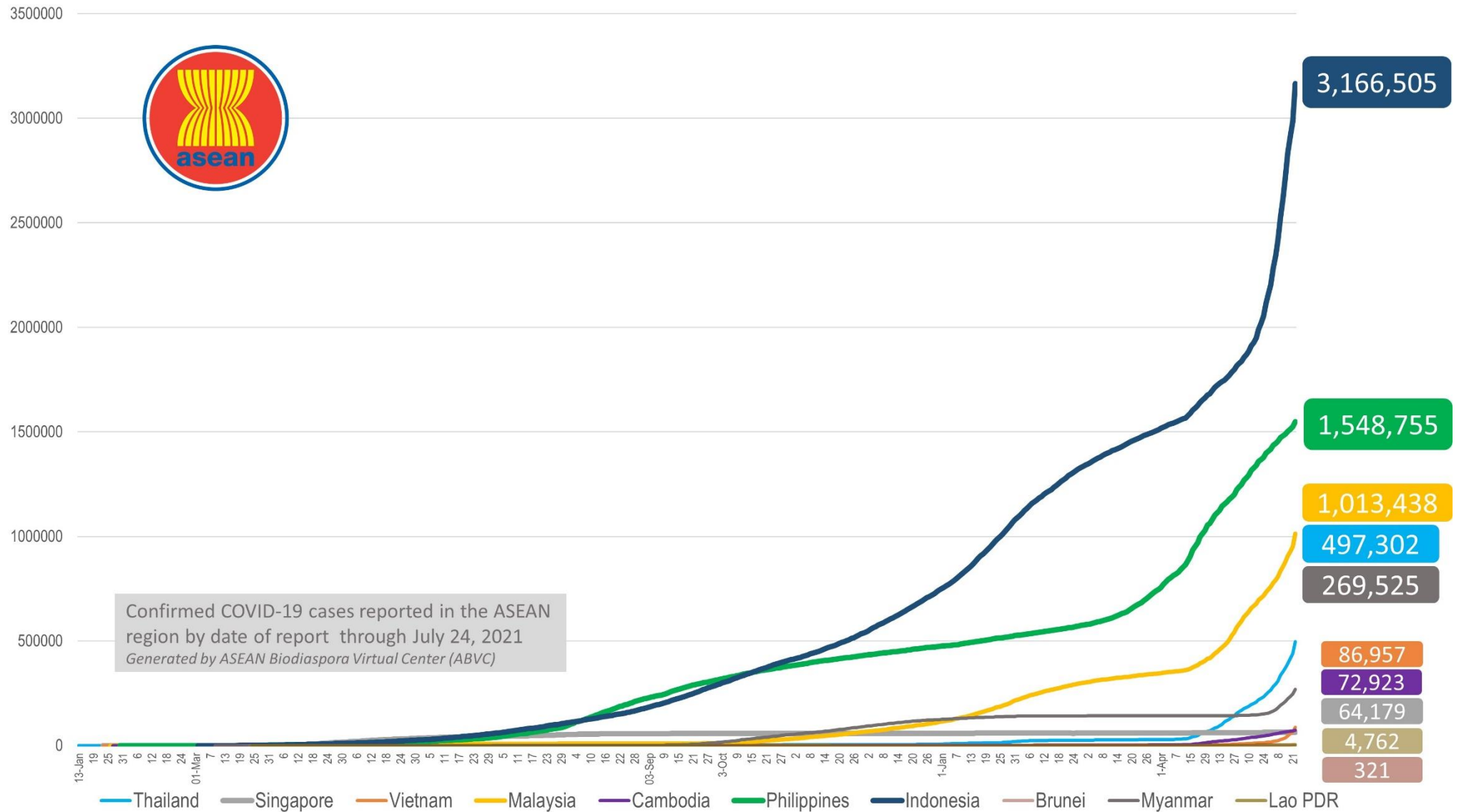
Cases and Deaths as of 25 July 2021

- As of 25 July 2021 (2PM, GMT+8), worldwide, there were **195,095,148** confirmed cases, including **4,179,578** deaths. Globally, Case Fatality Rate (CFR) was **2.1**.
- 6,724,667 confirmed cases** of COVID-19 have been reported in the ASEAN region with a total of **131,365 deaths**, with a CFR of **2.0**.

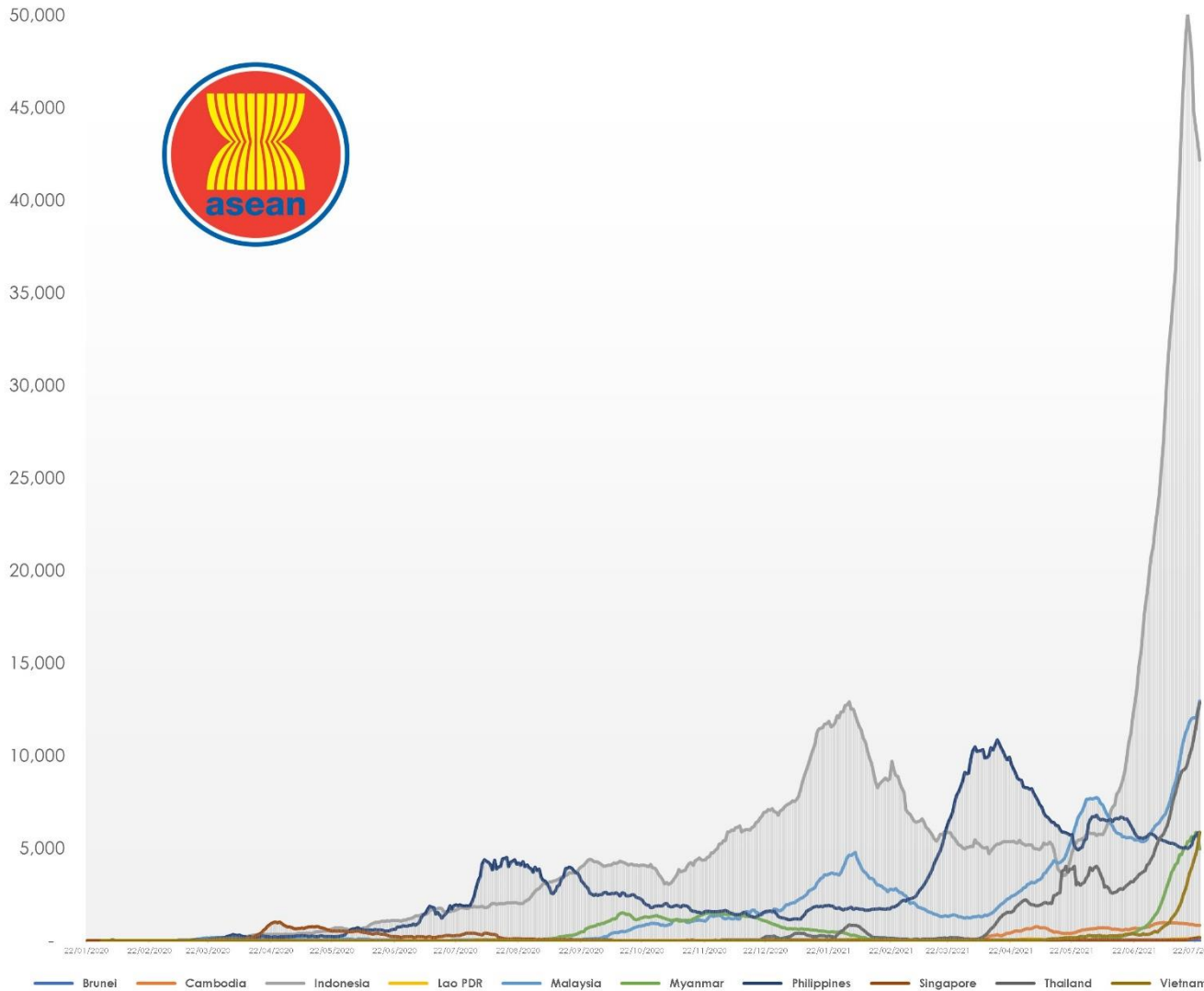
COVID-19 Epi curve among ASEAN Countries

as of 24 July 2021

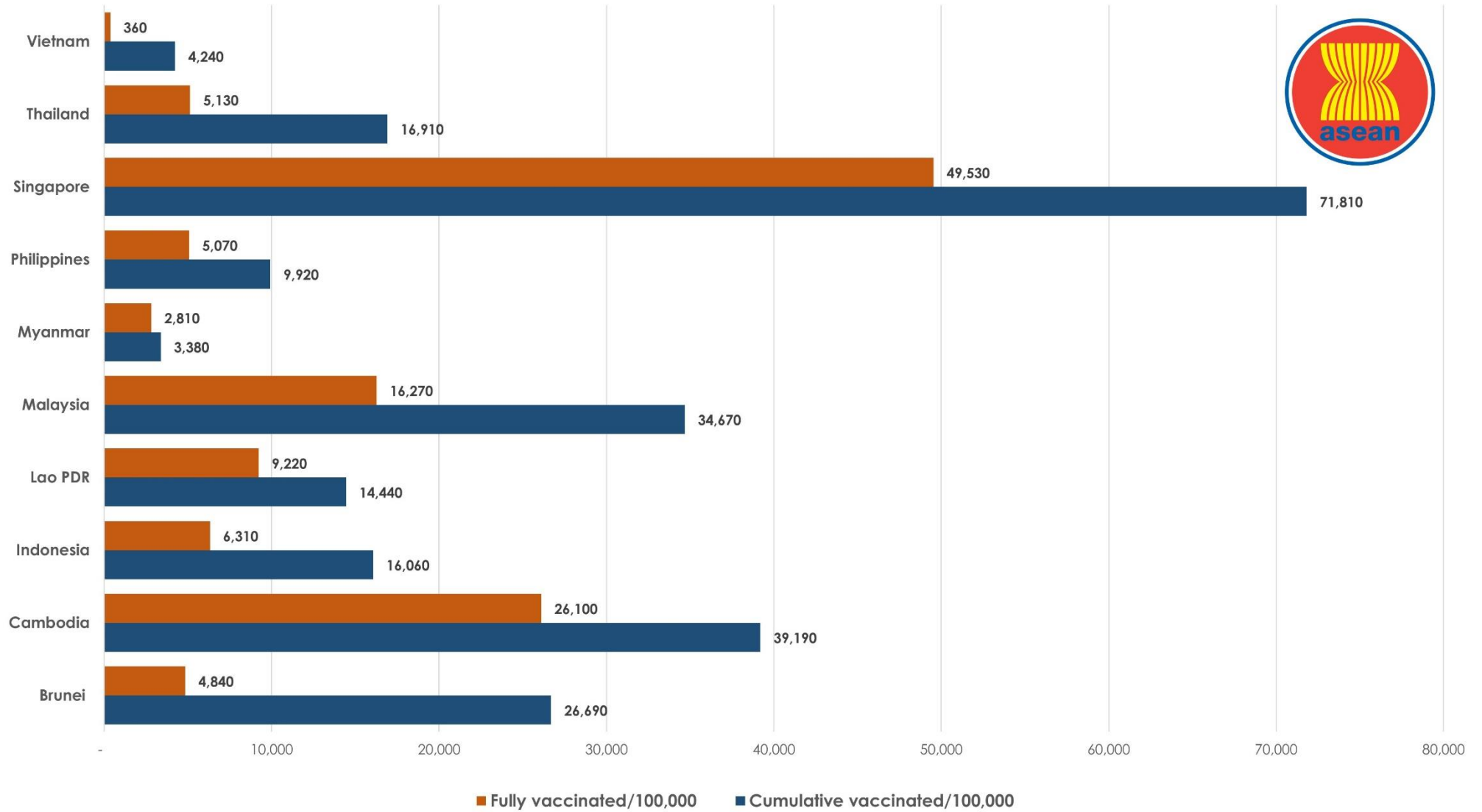
